MESSAGE FROM THE ALLENDALE WATER COMMITTEE



On November 30th Councilwoman Liz Homan and Mayor Ari Bernstein joined representatives from Veolia Water to sign the final papers completing the sale of Allendale's water system to Veolia.

"We are excited to welcome Allendale residents to the Veolia family," said Alan Weland, Vice President and General Manager of Veolia's New Jersey Operations. "We appreciate the confidence they have placed in Veolia to provide exceptional drinking water and excellent service. Our work will ensure our new customers will enjoy safe water and reliable service for generations to come."

Councilwoman Homan stated, "As the chair of the Allendale water committee, I am proud of our leadership team and the relationship we have developed with Veolia. The delivery of safe drinking water has become a very regulated, technical business and Allendale is fortunate to have Veolia provide affordable, quality water to Allendale residents for years to come."

Mayor Ari Bernstein added, "This has been a long journey, but one that will be very beneficial for the future of Allendale. I want to thank the residents of Allendale, Councilwoman Liz Homan, and everyone who has worked over the last year to make this final signing happen. "

For more than a decade, Veolia and Allendale enjoyed a long partnership, with the company providing half the borough's water and operating the system under contract. In November of 2021, faced with the need to make significant improvements to remain in compliance with water quality standards, the voters of Allendale overwhelmingly approved a referendum to sell the Allendale Water System to Veolia for \$18 million.

"After considerable research and analysis, the water committee and Borough Council decided the best option was to have a capable, regulated utility, with water professionals and experts managing the quality, safety, and distribution of our water. From a financial standpoint, the proceeds of the sale will be used to retire outstanding municipal debt, thereby strengthening the borough's financial position" said Councilwoman Homan. "I am thrilled that the residents of Allendale agreed."

Veolia plans to invest \$26 million over ten years in the borough. Projects will include water main refurbishments and replacements, water supply resiliency improvements, technology upgrades, lead service line replacements, and a treatment system for regulated PFAS, man-made chemicals commonly used in industrial and manufacturing applications.

The residents of Allendale will be contacted by Veolia with information about the sale and welcome them. The transition should be seamless; even the customer service phone number will remain the same.

"After having the honor of serving Allendale for two decades through our contracts with the Borough, we are proud that residents have entrusted us with ownership of the water system" concluded Mr. Weland.

Allendale Free Public Library aka Lee Memorial Library

The new year, 2023, will begin with an historic event to remember - the Allendale Free Public Library, aka Lee Memorial Library, will celebrate its 70th anniversary as a borough operated resource.

On January 6, 1953, the Allendale Public Library, maintained for its first fifty-two years by volunteers, user fees, and donations, was taken over by the borough of Allendale, becoming the Allendale Free Public Library.

Here's the story. Allendale's first public library began in December 1900 with the support of a committed community group, the Village Improvement Associate (VIA). After becoming a borough in 1894, Allendale's growth accelerated. Summer visitors became residents, farmland became residential neighborhoods, and the demand for services, including leisure and entertainment, took off. The VIA, with a few hundred donated books, launched Allendale's first library. Without adequate funding and a permanent home, the library was constantly on the move. Finally, in 1926, with land provided by the Mallinson family, the library opened the doors to its first permanent home on the corner of Franklin Turnpike and West Allendale Avenue (today's 1 West Allendale Avenue). With the generous financial support of William C. Lee and Mary K. Lee, the small library expanded with an addition in 1941. Use of the library continued to grow. Sadly, in 1952, Mr. Lee passed away. Recognizing his contributions, the Allendale Public Library was renamed as Lee Memorial Library. More books and more patrons created a never-ending need for more space and funding. After many years volunteering as librarian, Mary Lee decided to retire. With the loss of their most important benefactors, the library board asked the borough to take over their operations. With a November 1952 public referendum supporting a borough takeover of the library, on January 6, 1953, the Allendale Public Library trustees voted to disband the library. Minutes later, the new Allendale Free Public Library, operated by the borough of Allendale, and with a new board of trustees, was born. Upon her retirement, Mary Lee was named library advisor for life with a room in the library named in her honor. In February 1953, Hilda Sprague became the library's first paid part-time librarian. Friends of the Library was formed in 1971. In 1979, after years of continuing growth, the library moved to its current home at 500 West Crescent Avenue. In 1981, the borough sold the original building library building on Franklin Turnpike for \$101,000.

Over 1,000 residents received free admission to popular museums such as the Museum of Modern Art and the American Museum of Natural History, just two of the fourteen institutions for which we offer complimentary passes.

Get ready for the Holidays - Safety Tips!

Deck the Halls, Prevent the Falls

Take extra precaution when stringing lights or putting your blow-up Santa on the roof. Each year, at least five people die and more than 18,000 people need to seek emergency care due to injuries sustained while decorating for the holidays. Make sure your ladder is sturdy and you have someone spotting you at all times. Also, only climb when it's light outside. You should use ladders with indoor decor, as well, rather than chairs or tables.

Be Cautious in the Kitchen

Avoiding cuts and burns while cooking is another essential part of staying safe during the holidays. Have a supply of pot holders and oven mitts on hand, and don't touch any dish or plate that may still be hot. Keep a first aid kit nearby and stay alert when using a knife, whether you're carving the ham or chopping up the vegetable tray. If you do cut yourself, wash the wound, bandage it if possible and if there is excessive bleeding, a visit to the emergency department will be necessary.

Check in on Your Mental Health

For many, this may not be the most wonderful time of the year. Did you know 64% of people with a mental disorder reported that the holidays worsen their symptoms? Behavioral problems tend to be amplified during this season, whether you are experiencing depression due to loneliness or feeling anxious about gift shopping, parties or seeing certain family members.

If you don't have a mental disorder, be mindful of others who do. Pay attention to family and friends who may be struggling and check in with them often. If you or a family member are experiencing the signs or symptoms of a mental illness and feel you are in crisis, call **201-262-HELP (4357)**. Crisis counselors are available 24/7 to guide you through the next steps of getting help.

Don't Overdo Your Eating and Drinking

Holiday foods are filled with excess sugar, salt and fat. As you enjoy your favorite feasts and treats, do so in moderation. Consider a walk to burn off some calories and get your blood flowing-- instead of the traditional after-dinner nap!

Many people are also prone to binge drinking during holiday festivities. In fact, Americans double their drinking habits between Thanksgiving and New Year's! Drink plenty of water, space out your beverages and keep track of your intake to avoid alcohol poisoning. If you do end up drinking too much, always be sure you have a sober driver. And, if you're the host, have a place for intoxicated guests to stay overnight. 28% of fatal crashes in December involve drunk drivers, so plan ahead to ensure you and your loved ones don't become part of this unfortunate statistic.




220/230 West Crescent Update (formerly Black Millwork)



The Borough is almost through the legal documents with Hampshire and will close on 220 West Crescent (front building) in the very near future. As soon as the closing is complete, the front building will be demolished and they will begin building 70 units. The fencing and equipment have already been mobilized.

The Borough will be going to bid shortly after when plans are finalized to build a municipal community center.

The Borough closed on the back building (230 West Crescent) last year which currently functions as a small warehouse.



This entire project has been acquired and will be built without any additional tax dollars.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING REMINDERS

- All items should be put out **starting at 6pm the night before** the scheduled collection.
- Building materials and wood pallets **are not collected** by our garbage contractor. You must make your own arrangements to dispose of them.
- You must schedule a one-time, courtesy move-out pickup with info@AllendaleNJ.gov at **least 4 WEEKS in advance**. No metal, electronics, or recyclable materials collected.
- Remember to make sure that the lids are securely on top of your cans, especially garbage. This will help keep wildlife at bay.
- Collection containers can be no larger than 30 gallons.
- Bulk Trash must be placed on the curb and **not placed** in the road.
- Food containers being recycled need to be rinsed and cleaned before you dispose.
- Soiled pizza boxes are garbage and **NOT** recyclable.
