#### A Message from Mayor Amy Wilczynski...

We have had a busy start to the year. At our last meeting, the Council and myself discussed our goals for the year and pillars of success for Allendale. We are excited to share this with the community and gather your input. We plan on a series of town halls in the spirit of full government transparency. Residents will have the opportunity to ask any questions in a casual setting without a formal meeting or agenda. Dates are to be announced soon!

It was brought to my attention by Chief Mike Dillon that a company has been requesting body cam footage through the OPRA system. OPRA stands for Open Public Records Act and was created to promote transparent government. However, the system has been abused over the years with no reform in sight. The most recent abuse comes in the form of 'bad actors' targeting young women when they are pulled over in mostly sad and vulnerable situations. They use the videos to exploit women by displaying them on YouTube. I've reached out to Senator Schepisi to see if there was something she could do on a state level. There is currently a bill initiated to address this and she requested to be a co-sponsor. I will keep everyone informed of the outcome.

There has also been a big uptick in scams, particularly targeting the elderly. Please NEVER give out any information to anyone over the phone and never let anyone talk you into buying gift cards which is another scam and red flag.

At our last council meeting, we passed a resolution opposing NJ State Legislature Bill A4/S50. This bill proposes an overhaul of Fair Share Housing that is imposing unrealistic obligations and onerous standards for the fourth round which starts in 2025. The burden on municipalities is daunting and it's very disappointing that there is no consideration for traffic, schools, fire, ambulance, police, and the environment! The Council and I are attending as many meetings as we can about this to educate ourselves and try to navigate a plan for Allendale. This is something every NJ resident should be staying on top of as well!

There was a kickoff fundraiser for the new mural project downtown that was well attended. Thank you Allendale Social for hosting such a lovely event. The mural is going to be a beautiful work of art that is called ceramic bas-relief, which is a 3-D effect. Children from all 3 schools are involved in this creation and are having a blast working with Allendale resident and sculptor Simon Rigg. He was recently featured in 201 Magazine recognizing his work all around the world. We are fortunate to have him involved in this project.

## ALLENDALE HISTORY BOROUGH HISTORIAN REMEMBERING FRANK PARENTI A MODEST HERO



Borough marshal Frank Parenti Circa 1950s

Longtime Allendale resident and Police Chief Frank Parenti will forever be remembered as a veteran of the United States Navy, and as an Allendale volunteer, police chief, and councilman.

Frank Parenti, Jr. was born in Brooklyn, drafted into the U.S. Navy, and saw action in World War II. He was a gunner on a ship, participated in the D-Day invasion and the island campaign in the Pacific, and was decorated with the Purple Heart for a wound he received when a shell exploded on the deck of his ship.

He came to Allendale with his family in 1946, and soon began his career in law enforcement. Beginning as a part-time marshal, he earned 55 cents per hour. In 1952, along with Robert Wilson, they both became the borough's two full-time police officers. In 1959, the police department was reorganized with Robert Wilson serving as chief and Frank as his sergeant. On March 26, 1959, when Frank was promoted to Lieutenant, Mayor Newman said, "We are quite fortunate to have such a man in our police department."

In 1962, Frank was awarded the State PBA Award for Valor and the Grand Jurors Assn. Valor Award for arresting Michael Salvi, an armed murderer who escaped from custody. Recognizing his heroism, a January 25, 1962, newspaper headline shouted, "A Modest Hero Captures Killer." In 1964, he was given the American Red Cross

Life Saving Award for bringing a baby back to life with mouth-to-mouth resuscitation.



January 3, 1959. Upon the reorganization of the police department, Police Chief Robert Wilson and Sergeant Frank Parenti are sworn into office in the firehouse by Mayor George A. Dean.

Upon the retirement of Chief Wilson, Lt. Parenti was promoted to chief, sworn in on June 1, 1967, by Mayor Joseph Waldorf. Chief Parenti retired on January

1, 1990. Asked what changed most since starting on the force, Chief Parenti replied, "The traffic. The traffic is terrible."

Chief Parenti loved Allendale, "I love the people of this town. This is a great town. It's hard to find a town like this one." Frank and wife Shirley Hover, married in 1947, parents of Roger and Jill, lived on West Maple Street. After retirement, he continued his community service serving on the borough council from 1994-1996.

#### Stream Clearing Guidance

Recently, the question has been asked, is the Borough of Allendale responsible for the clearance of streams that flow through the Borough on private property or within legal easements?

The answer is no. The Borough of Allendale is not responsible for the clearance of streams that flow through the Borough on private property or easements. Property owners are the parties responsible for the maintenance and cleaning of waterways, which can be undertaken privately, under certain limited circumstances, without the issuance of an NJ DEP permit.

Stream cleaning entails desilting or de-snagging a channel or removing accumulated garbage or debris from an active waterway. It does not entail making a channel deeper or wider than it previously was, as this could result in worsened flooding on properties located downstream of the area to be cleaned. Stream cleaning is a regulated activity under NJ Flood Hazard Area Control Act Rules. These Rules (NJAC 7: 13-7.l et seq.) generally authorize property owners, under defined circumstances, to remove accumulated debris when such removal can be done without securing an actual DEP Permit. In most instances, debris can be removed without a permit if it does not require the use of heavy machinery.

Recently, the County of Bergen has also issued updated guidance on stream clearing. The County has indicated that certain stream clearing activities may be undertaken by County Mosquito Control agencies only when necessary to control mosquito infestation. To that end, the County will only undertake such operations to prevent the accumulation of stagnant water, thus reducing the need for regular mosquito treatments. Such County assistance is provided only at the written request of municipalities, which must be accompanied by a multitude of engineering and legal requirements, including indemnity and hold harmless provisions.

#### GARBAGE & RECYCLING REMINDERS

- All items should be put out *starting at 6pm the night before* the scheduled collection.
- Building materials and wood pallets are not collected by our garbage contractor. You must make your own arrangements to dispose of them.
- You must schedule a one-time, courtesy move-out pickup with <u>info@AllendaleNJ.gov</u> at <u>least</u> 4 WEEKS in advance. No metal, electronics, or recyclable materials collected.

Remember to make sure that the lids are securely on top of your cans, especially garbage. This

will help keep wildlife at bay.

- Collection containers can be no larger than 30 gallons.
- Bulk Trash must be placed on the curb and **not placed** in the road.
- Food containers being recycled need to be rinsed and cleaned before you dispose.
- Soiled pizza boxes are garbage and NOT recyclable.

#### GARBAGE

- Household kitchen, office and bathroom Container One: trash
- Styrofoam

#### **BULKY TRASH**

- Furniture
- Carpeting
- Non-metal items
- Windows/mirrors/pane glass must be taped with an "X'

#### METAL

- Anything that is least 75% metal
- Artificial Holiday Trees

- Newspapers and inserts
- Junk mail, envelopes, office, notebook, construction paper
- Smooth and corrugated cardboard
