We hosted the first Town Hall since I have become Mayor. The purpose was to inform and address questions regarding the 220 West Crescent project and Well #11. We met at the Red Barn and had about 100 residents attend. We plan on having more of these as well as additional dates for 'Coffee with the Mayor and Council'. Our goal is to be as transparent as possible about everything in Allendale. We are all a very accessible bunch and are happy to talk to residents at any time! We had an incredibly special Mayor and Council meeting on June 15th. Congratulations to our 3 new police officers that were sworn in: Christian Moore, Justin Hugerich, and Dimitri Forde.

We also had proclamations for 3 Allendale Heroes. Stiles Thomas, who led efforts with Mayor Ed FitzPatrick, to save 107 acres of wetlands and turn them into the Celery Farm Natural Area. He was also the town's marsh warden for 26 years and a World War II veteran who led his fellow veterans when they marched in Allendale's Memorial Day parade every year.

Colonel Rick Jackson had an extremely distinguished career in the USMC in various leadership positions all over the world serving our country. We presented him with a 'key to the city' since no matter where he lived, he considered Allendale his hometown.

Joseph Thadeus Ward was in the Air Force and recently retired from the CIA after a total of 43 years providing security for this country. Worth noting... he was section Lead in the successful operation to track down and neutralize Ayman al-Zawahiri, the #2 terrorist after Bin Laden.

The Borough also celebrated Armed Forces Day for the first time. We discovered that we have 21 'kids' who are currently serving in the military. We gave them and their families a certificate and a blue star flag to hang in their window to recognize the household as having an active military member. Incredibly we have 1 family with 2 serving members (2 stars) and another with 3. We plan on making this day a yearly tradition in Allendale. THANK YOU all for your service!!

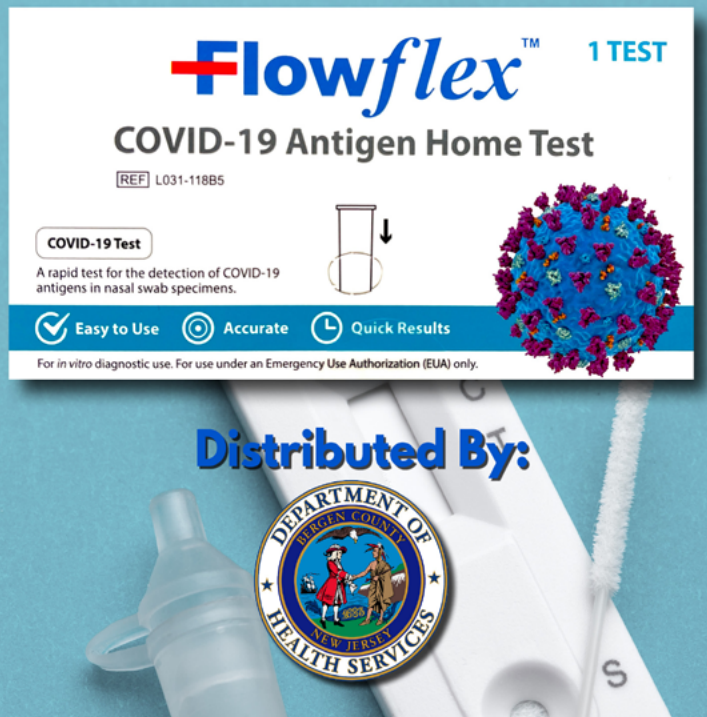

220/230 West Crescent Update

(formerly Black Millwork)

220 West Crescent Ave (front portion of Black Millwork) will be comprised of 70 residential rentals AND a municipal community center. Currently, you only see the 70 rental units from the street. The Borough has not begun to build the community center yet as we still have to go to bid. Our building will be directly in front of and attached to the 70 residential units.



The rental units are owned and operated by Hampshire. The Borough will own our community center and owns the land that it sits on.

The community center will be a wonderful addition to Allendale.

We currently do not have space to house meetings and events for all of our wonderful organizations. This much-needed space will benefit the entire community, from kids to seniors. It will be for Allendale residents only. We look forward to getting input from the community as we get closer to completing the project.

The Borough closed on the back building (230 West Crescent) last year which currently functions as a small warehouse.

The current Borough Hall offices at 500 W. Crescent will remain there as well as the Borough Council chambers, Lee Memorial Library will also remain in its space at 500 WC.

It's summer and also time to think about Water Safety. Lakes, beaches, rivers, and pools are popular destinations and the best way to have fun family time and remain cool as temperatures rise. As you embark on your Summer fun, be mindful of potential hazards and risks for yourself and your children. Drowning is the #1 cause of accidental death in children ages 1-4. This summer, live by the following water safety tips from www.ndpa.org for open water and pools to protect your family:

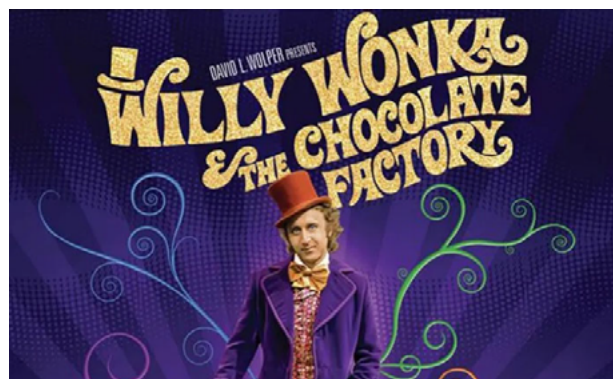
1. Teach your children how to swim.
2. Educate children about pool and water safety.
3. Never leave a child unsupervised near water.
4. Never swim alone. Find a "swim buddy"
5. Swim in designated swimming areas, and preferably under the supervision of a qualified lifeguard.
6. When in doubt, get out. Whether it is rain, the current is getting rough or you are getting tired, trust your instincts.
7. Know the weather and water conditions. Be mindful and check the water temperature and weather conditions before hitting the water
8. Choose the right equipment. Wetsuits if the water is cold, goggles, life vests and bright swim shirts for children.
9. Understand currents and rip tides. If you do get caught in a rip tide, do not panic. Remain calm and swim parallel to the shore. Most rip currents are an average of 100 feet wide.
10. Don't drink while in the water alcohol affects your perception of danger and impairs your balance and coordination.
11. Wear A USCG-approved life vest, especially if you are a weak swimmer or a young child.

ALLENDALE HISTORY

ALLENDALE AMBULANCE CORPS

Organized first aid came to Allendale in July 1937, when a 1926 REO ambulance was offered to Dr. Fred Kanning by the Hackensack Hospital for \$1. Dr. Kanning put the matter before police chief William Reimer. "You get it and we'll drive it," said Chief Reimer. So, Dr. Kanning made the arrangements, and with its first ambulance, the Allendale Ambulance Corps formed on July 8, 1937. Carl Wehner and Paul D. O'Connor served as the first ambulance corps president and captain, respectively. Dr. Kanning was appointed surgeon to the AAC. Other founding members included Nelson White, Henry Kahse, Cyril Dargue, Archie Farrell, Gus Sohne, Charles Bijou, Harold Ryan, Harold Kiermaier, Earl Israel, George Price, Jake Kaplan, Walter Christie, William Strangfeld, Ken Booth, Larry Scafuro, John L. Winters, William Hill, and James Kievit.

In 1939, at a cost of \$3,500 for the ambulance and \$750 for appliances, a new, fully equipped ambulance was bought with the help and advice of Dr. Harry Archer of the New York City Fire Department. Located alongside the firehouse at Erie Plaza, the first ambulance headquarters was dedicated on October 20, 1940, with a later addition, completed in 1959, providing a meeting room and storage space.

After having completed the standard and advanced Red Cross first aid courses, Ethel Tellefsen, age 33, shattered the Allendale glass ceiling in February 1969 when she was officially sworn in as the first female member of the corps. In 1976, Tellefsen was sworn in as president of Allendale Ambulance Corps.

Allendale ambulance rig No. 11 was dedicated in her honor in 2007.

Originally dedicated on June 13, 1981, the new Allendale Ambulance Corps building on Franklin Turnpike near Arcadia Road was rededicated on June 13, 2008 as the John L. Alsdorf Ambulance Building in recognition of Alsdorf's 50 years of service with the corps.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING REMINDERS

- All items should be put out *starting at 6pm the night before* the scheduled collection.
- Building materials and wood pallets *are not collected* by our garbage contractor. You must make your own arrangements to dispose of them.
- You must schedule a one-time, courtesy move-out pickup with info@AllendaleNJ.gov at *least 4 WEEKS in advance*. No metal, electronics, or recyclable materials collected.
- Remember to make sure that the lids are securely on top of your cans, especially garbage. This will help keep wildlife at bay.
- Collection containers can be no larger than 30 gallons.
- Bulk Trash must be placed on the curb and **not placed** in the road.
- Food containers being recycled need to be rinsed and cleaned before you dispose.
- Soiled pizza boxes are garbage and **NOT** recyclable.
