A Message from Mayor Amy Wilczynski . . .

It was so nice seeing so many of you on Allendale Day. The weather held out and we had hundreds of residents come out. Thanks to Scott Miller and Zach Lisella for all their hard work in organizing this event on behalf of the Chamber of Commerce. They were already looking into planning for next year at the last Chamber meeting.

I want to thank ALL residents for their patience through all the infrastructure upgrades with both Veolia and PSE&G. Regardless of all the coordination, there are many variables and the best-laid plans are changed constantly. These are important upgrades, and I promise we are at the tail end of it.

Councilwoman Lovisolo and I attended a Mayor's Roundtable down in Princeton hosted by the NJ State League of Municipalities to share ideas and identify challenges with Fair Share Housing in light of the upcoming NEW round in 2025. We hope to develop concrete constructive proposals for Legislative and Administrative consideration. This is a topic of concern for all municipalities, and I encourage everyone to educate themselves on this. Always happy to answer any questions.

I also attended the NJ Conference of Mayors in Seaside to hear Speaker Shawn LaTourette, NJDEP Commissioner. I wanted to attend because the topic was flood mitigation in NJ in coastal communities and also 'river' towns like ours. We are currently holding meetings with our town engineer and planner to take a closer look at the flooding issues that have been occurring in Allendale and surrounding towns.

I was happy to hear that Veolia has shut down Well 11 and keep it offline until the temporary treatment is installed. The full letter detailing this can be found on their website.

The building of the Community center is finally beginning! The lowest responsible bidder was Dinallo Construction Corp (DCC). We look forward to awarding this contract and working with DCC in the upcoming months as our community center gets built.

New Business: We had another Ribbon Cutting. Welcome Ellie Mental Health. Compassionately transforming the culture of mental healthcare with creative solutions...



PETE CAUWENBERGHS - MR. DPW

Longtime Allendale resident Peter "Pete" L. Cauwenberghs will forever be remembered as Allendale's Mr. DPW, truly a "man for all seasons."

After 37 years working for the Borough of Allendale, Pete retired at the end of 1984 as superintendent of the Roads, Public Buildings, and Grounds Department. After serving his country in the Navy during World War II, he later served his borough as ambulance corps captain and borough marshal.

Police Chief Frank Parenti recalled the days when he and Pete were marshals together. "The police department had been abolished for economy reasons so there were no full-time officers, just marshals, paid 55 cents hourly. Pete and I used to work shifts together. One time, someone played a joke on us and put a ram in the back room of the police station (where Park Crest Cleaners is now). The chief handed Pete a broom and told him to get rid of the animal. Well, the ram butted Pete all the way into the front room and knocked over a coal burning stove on its way out the door. We never did find out who put the ram in the back room. We never knew where the ram went, either."

Pete and wife Erma are the proud parents of Gail, Peter Jr., Sue, Keith, and Rick. Their son Keith followed in his dad's footsteps, working for the Allendale Department of Public Works (DPW), retiring in 2012 as director of operations after 41 years.

The Cauwenberghs will forever be remembered for their selfless contributions to Allendale with the DPW headquarters on New Street being renamed as the Cauwenberghs Building on September 28, 2012. Photos courtesy of Keith Cauwenberghs.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING REMINDERS

- All items should be put out *starting at 6pm the night before* the scheduled collection.
- Building materials and wood pallets *are not collected* by our garbage contractor. You must make your own arrangements to dispose of them.
- You must schedule a one-time, courtesy move-out pickup with info@AllendaleNJ.gov at **least 4 WEEKS in advance**. No metal, electronics, or recyclable materials collected.
- Remember to make sure that the lids are securely on top of your cans, especially garbage. This will help keep wildlife at bay.
- Collection containers can be no larger than 30 gallons.
- Bulk Trash must be placed on the curb and **not placed** in the road.
- Food containers being recycled need to be rinsed and cleaned before you dispose.
- Soiled pizza boxes are garbage and **NOT** recyclable.
