A Regular Session Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale was held in the Municipal Building at 500 West Crescent Avenue, Allendale, NJ on March 11, 2021. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, access to the public was provided via GoToMeeting video and teleconferencing only, with adequate notice of same posted for public viewing. The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor Bernstein who reminded the public to mute their devices so as not to distract from the business at hand. Mayor Bernstein advised the public that they would have several opportunities at appropriate times throughout this meeting to be heard.

Mayor Bernstein asked that the Acting Municipal Clerk read the open public meetings statement: "In compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act, the notice requirements have been satisfied. The meeting dates for the year are confirmed at the Annual Meeting, are posted on the public bulletin board in the Municipal Building, published in The Record within the first 10 days of the New Year, and copies are sent to The Ridgewood News and Star Ledger."

The Mayor led those present in a salute to the flag.

After the flag salute, Mayor Bernstein called for a Moment of Silence in remembrance of the oneyear anniversary of the start of the COVID-19 pandemic and in memory of all the lives that have been lost to this virus

Public Comment on Agenda Items Only:

James Thomas, 30 Arlton Ave., asked if the signing of the documents referred to in the resolutions on the consent agenda wrapped up the 220/230 project. Borough Attorney Wiss gave a detailed overview of the status of the 220/230 project and the resolutions on tonight's consent agenda. Mr. Thomas followed up with a question regarding a pilot agreement on the property to which Mr. Wiss and Councilwoman Wilczynski discussed the timeline and financial calculations for the pilot agreement. Mr. Thomas then inquired about the residential portion and the start of the construction of the Municipal Building. Mr. Wiss explained that the Borough had to look at what specific plans were presented at the Land Use Board and noted that the Borough is proceeding accordingly. Mayor's Report:

Mayor Bernstein's report was started during the Work Session. He continued with the following report:

I appreciate the work that our OEM and Board of health have continued to do for the protection of Allendale's residents. We have worked together as a community to look out for each other in ways that we could have never expected or contemplated. We are stronger today then we were one year ago.

One year later the sun is shining and everyone's spirits are on the up. Spring is around the corner and planning for outdoor sports are underway. With COVID numbers always on our minds, I am hopeful that the additional Johnson & Johnson vaccine approval will further open up opportunities for our most vulnerable community members and those who are currently approved to receive the vaccine.

I have been saying for four months, or for at least six weeks, that we've been trying to get the vaccine to the seniors, to everyone in Allendale, particularly the seniors, we have asked whether we could set up as a distribution site, et cetera. We've knocked on a lot of doors. I think we're finally making some headway with that. We will bring that to the public a successful path that we're going to be able to take to get the vaccine to Allendale seniors.

I am also pleased to report that Bergen County Executive Jim Tedesco and the Board of Commissioners have announced that the County has partnered with EZ RIDE to provide seniors age 60 and over with rides for COVID-19 vaccinations at Bergen New Bridge Medical Center. Rides will be provided through companies such as Lyft and Uber under a program known as Ryde4Life, which is part of the EZ Ride network. The program will be coordinated through the Bergen County Division of Community Transportation and the Division of Senior Services that will work together to approve applications submitted by residents for service.

To schedule a ride, seniors can call the Bergen County Division of Community Transportation at 201-368-5955. Seniors interested in accessing the Ryde4Life program must have a working cell phone with them during the transportation service and must apply for the ride 24 hours in advance of their appointment. As always, this and other important information can be found on our "COVID-19 Information Hub" on our website, www.allendalenj.gov.

On a municipal level, we are hoping that legislation will be passed to provide some funding to local governments to make up for the hardships that COVID-19 has created. I want to thank the employees who have and are continuing to work on submitting applications for potential expense reimbursement and pursuing other available funds to offset necessary purchases.

Thank you to our IT Consultant Jim Coban of Coban Computers and Tyler Yaccarino for their efforts to follow through with the Borough's new phone system as noted in the resolutions this evening, which will provide substantial savings, projected tens of thousands of dollars, and optimal continued service to our residents.

Compost Permits go on sale this Monday, March 15th. Applications can be filled out online on the Borough's website www.allendalenj.gov. The price remains the same as it was last year, \$30 and the site will be open beginning on Saturday, April 10th. Operating hours are Saturdays from 9:00am to 3:00pm and Sundays from 9:00am to 1:00pm. Thank you to Ron and his DPW crew for preparing the site which so many Allendale residents use.

Please also mark your calendars for the Borough's Shredding Day sponsored by the Bergen County Utilities Authority. It will take place on Saturday, May 22. Starting cleaning out your files now! The Clerk's office is also making plans to have other services available to residents on the same day making it a "one-stop shop."

Daylight Savings Time is happening this Sunday, March 14th. Remember to adjust your clocks! Spring is finally almost here!

Staff Report:

Raymond Wiss, Borough Attorney stated that most of what he has worked on has been discussed in the reports and is reflected on the agenda.

Michelle Ryan, Acting Clerk reported that the Clerk's Office is busy helping residents, processing pet licenses, answering OPRA's and is ready to start processing compost applications on Monday. She shared that improvements were made in an effort to make the audio clearer for everyone joining the meeting and thanked Tyler Yaccarino, John Gil, and Tatiana Marquis for working together to make those improvements. She and the Council wished Tatiana Marquis a Happy Birthday!

Mr. Kistner had no report.

Public Comment on any issue:

Mark Stavastano, 22 Vreeland Place, stated that he was sorry that he was unable to watch the last virtual water meeting but would watch it when it goes online. He then thanked Mayor Bernstein for his work and response to the COVID pandemic. Mr. Savastano then gave an update on the work of the Green Team and discussed Sustainable Jersey Grants that can be pursued.
