Tyler Yaccarino Councilman We made it through the nor'easter, and now fall is officially here! Soon, our town will be bursting with vibrant color. There's no better place to take in the beauty of the season than at Crestwood Park.

Our **Curbside Leaf Collection** schedule begins the week of October 13th—you can find the full schedule in this newsletter. Free biodegradable leaf bags are still available to residents and can be picked up at the DPW (Monday-Friday, 8 AM–3 PM) or at the Recycling Center (Wednesdays, 4–7 PM).

We continue to make great progress on our **capital field rehabilitation projects**, including Fields 4 (Kunisch), 5, and 6, which should be completed within the next few weeks. Planning sessions for new **outdoor tennis and pickleball courts** will begin later this month, and we've also started early planning for infrastructure improvements at **Crestwood Lake** scheduled for next year.

Our next Land Use Committee meeting will focus on developing a strategic five-year plan for sidewalks and street paving. We've curated a priority list with input from our town engineer and DPW superintendent and are exploring opportunities for state and county grant funding.

Mark your calendars for **Friday**, **October 24th**, **from 3–7 PM**—we'll be hosting another **Open House at the Community Center!** This event is for everyone—bring the whole family! Enjoy kids' games, face painting, and a chance to explore the new space, share your ideas, and see what's happening in our community.

Our recent **Town Hall meeting** was once again packed. These meetings offer another way to engage directly with residents outside of our regular council sessions. We discussed the **4th round of the state-mandated Fair Share Housing obligations**. Like more than 400 other municipalities, our plan has been challenged. We're working closely with our professional team to ensure the best possible outcome with minimal impact on Allendale. I also shared important updates about Guardian Angel Church, which were confirmed by Bishop Saporito:

- The Archdiocese of Newark has **no strategic intention to close the church**.
- Mergers may begin in **July 2027**, but this timeline depends on readiness.
- These mergers involve parish governance, not the physical church buildings.
- Decisions regarding the sale of any church will be made by the local community.
- If a parish is **viable and sustainable**, it is very likely to **remain open**.

I plan to continue these discussions with Bishop Saporito, Cardinal Tobin, and will also write to the Pope on behalf of the Borough.

Congratulations to **Allendale resident Chloe Levy** for winning the **Pocket Park Design Competition**! We're applying for County grants to begin construction this fall, with completion expected by next spring. This project will be a beautiful addition to our downtown, complementing the new mural and streetscape.

I also attended two Mayors' meetings this month, which are always valuable opportunities to share ideas and coordinate efforts among neighboring towns. A recurring topic has been the **growing issue of e-bikes**. There's momentum behind potential legislation to require registration, similar to cars. Many mayors expressed concern that kids are using these vehicles without training, and that parents need to take a stronger role in discussing safety and local rules. Relying solely on police enforcement isn't the most effective approach and can create unnecessary tension between youth and law enforcement. It was also noted that the speed of many e-bikes can be easily modified to go faster—another safety concern we'll continue to monitor.

Don't forget to get out and VOTE! Lots of voting info in this newsletter.

Finally, I hope to see everyone at the **ARC 5K this Sunday!** It's a fun, family-friendly event right here in Allendale—and it's not too late to sign up.

Please stay informed: sign up for alerts and emails and follow the Mayor Amy Wilczynski Facebook and Instagram pages as well as the Borough Facebook page. Also feel free to contact any council member or myself. If you know someone who does not have access to a computer, please let us know so we can mail them Borough updates. 

Top 5 Things To Know About In-Person Early Voting

Here are the answers to five common questions about in-person early voting for the 2025 General Election:

1. WHAT IS IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING?

This option enables all registered voters to cast their ballot in person, using a voting machine, during a nine-day period prior to General Election Day. You can choose to vote in person when it's most convenient for your schedule.

2. WHERE CAN I ACCESS IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING?

- No matter where you live in the county, you can vote your specific ballot at any of your county's designated in-person early voting locations.
- Find your county's sites at VOTE.NJ.GOV.

3. WHEN CAN I ACCESS IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING?

- In-person early voting locations will be open Saturday, October 25 through Sunday, November 2.
- Hours will be Monday-Saturday, 10:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. and Sunday, 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. No appointment is necessary. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities.

4. WHAT IF I ALWAYS VOTE BY MAIL, BUT NOW WANT TO VOTE EARLY IN PERSON INSTEAD?

 If you are registered to vote by mail in the 2025 General Election, you may cast a provisional ballot during early in-person voting or on Election Day, which will be provided to you at your early voting location or polling place. If you choose to vote by provisional ballot during early in-person voting or on Election Day, you should not complete and return your mail-in ballot as doing so will result in your provisional ballot being rejected. Learn more about provisional ballots at **VOTE.NJ.GOV**. If you no longer wish to receive a mail-in ballot, reach out to your County Clerk's office for more information.

5. CAN I STILL CHOOSE FROM OTHER VOTING OPTIONS?

Yes. You may select, instead, to:

- Vote in person at your polling place, from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, November 4. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities. Go to **VOTE.NJ.GOV** for your polling place, listed on the Polling Locations page.
- Or, apply for a mail-in ballot and return it one of the following ways...
 - 1... Secure Ballot Drop Box: Place it in one of your county's secure ballot drop boxes by 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 4. Drop box locations can be found at VOTE.NJ.GOV.
 - 2... Board of Elections Office: Deliver it in person to your county's Board of Elections Office by 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 4. County Election Officials' contact information can be found at VOTE.NJ.GOV.
 - 3... Mail: It must be postmarked on or before 8:00 p.m. Tuesday, November 4 and be received by your county's Board of Elections on or before Monday, November 10.

NOTE: Mail-in ballots CANNOT be returned to your early voting site or polling place.

How to Vote In Person at the Polls on General Election Day



1... Be sure you're registered to vote. Check your registration status using the Am I Registered? link at VOTE.NJ.GOV.



2... Verify your polling place using the Polling Location link at VOTE.NJ.GOV or by contacting your County Board of Elections. Contact information is available at VOTE.NJ.GOV.



3... Check in at the registration table at your polling place.
NOTE: If there are anyissues verifyingyoureligibilityto vote or if you have already been issued amail-in ballot, you maybe issuedaprovisionalballot. Details on this type of ballot are available at VOTE.NJ.GOV.



4... Sign the electronic poll book, after which you will be issued your ballot.



5... Depending on your county, you will be directed to either a voting machine or provided with a paper ballot and directed to a private booth.



6... Read the instructions for each section and complete your ballot carefully. Some races askyou to mark more thanone candidate. If youwishtoleavearace blank, you may do so without affect- ing any other portion of your ballot. NOTE: Paper ballots may have more than one side or page, so look carefully to be sure you vote for each race you intend to. Cross-outs on paper ballots will render the ballot invalid. If you wish to make a change to your paper ballot before casting it, take your ballot to a poll worker to receive a new paper ballot.



7...If you have any concerns regarding your ballot , including if it is smudged or damaged, tell a poll worker to ensureyour votingchoicescanandwill be counted.



8... Once you complete these steps, your ballot is ready to go into the ballot box or tabulating machine, depending on the tabulation process used by your polling place.



9... Inorder to count, your vote must be cast by 8 p.m. on General Election Day, Tuesday, November 4, 2025. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities.

How to Become a Poll Worker for the General Election

2... WHO CAN APPLY?

You can apply to serve as a poll worker in New Jersey if you:

- Are a United States citizen and a resident of New Jersey.
- Are a registered voter in the county in which you reside.
- Are at least 16 years of age. College and high school students are encouraged to apply. Note: Those under 18 years of age will work limited hours per shift and do not have to be registered to vote. Contact the County Board of Elections for further information.
- Are not running as a candidate in this election.

3... WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO KNOW?

Possible work dates span Saturday, October 25 through Sunday, November 2 (the in-person early voting period) and Tuesday, November 4 (Election Day). Hours and days may vary.

Do Not Enter the Polling Place, or Stand within 100 feet of the Outside Entrance of the Polling Place, WEARING or DISPLAYING Anything that may offer Support for or opposition against any Candidate, Party or Public Question on the Ballot. Any political badge, button, insignia, t-shirt, hat or other display that can be read or viewed to identify support or opposition of a candidate, political party or public questions is banned from this polling location.

19:34-15. If a person shall distribute or display any circular or printed matter or offer any suggestion or solicit any support for any candidate, party or public question within the polling place or room or within a distance of one hundred feet of the outside entrance to such polling place or room, he shall be guilty of a-disorderly persons offense.

19:34-19. No person shall display, sell, give or provide any political badge, button or other insignia to be worn at or within one hundred feet of the polls or within the polling place or room, on any primary, general or special election day or on any commission government election day, except the badge furnished by the county board as herein provided.

A person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a disorderly persons offense.
