Council Committee Reports

Councilman Tyler Yaccarino - **Facilities, Parks and Recreation.** Councilman Yaccarino stated he would like to suspend his official report for this evening; however, he would like to express his gratitude to our Armed Force members, past and current. He's happy to be part of this celebration of you all this evening for the second year in a row.

Councilwoman Susanne Lovisolo - Finance, Human Resources, Administration and Information Technology, Land Use and Construction Code and Council Liaison to Library Board. Councilwoman Lovisolo stated that the Land Use Committee will have its meeting next Thursday morning at 8:30 a.m. at borough hall. Our agenda is already filling up.

The Finance, Admin, and HR Committee, went from meeting weekly, if not daily, in the lead up to the introduction and approval of our budget and then our contract negotiations. I also want to take a moment to commend our borough hall team. Another great election. Thank you, Linda and John, from our Clerk's Office, our Finance Department, our Building Department. We have a really great group of people who are exceedingly helpful with whatever our residents need, and I just want to thank them all.

Regarding the Lee Memorial Library, they are very pleased to announce that they have a brand-new website which is very user-friendly. It has a fresh updated look and it's easy to navigate. It features easy access to their catalog, your library account and event calendar. They also have information concerning their collections including museum passes, borrowing beyond books and digital resources. Their on-site services, such as notary, ESL tutors, printing and copying. Check out their brand-new website.

Thank you to all of you who are here tonight. A special message to all who serve in our Armed Forces, our Veterans, and your family members. Gary Sinise, I heard, was recently interviewed about the work he does and his life's mission to support the men and women who serve and defend our country. I think we're all familiar with the Gary Sinise Foundation and the many honors that Gary has received, but what I've found fascinating by the interview was him talking about the reason he even started this foundation. I just want to share that real quick with all of you.

"After the attacks on September 11th, my heart was broken. As fear crept in as to what the future would hold for our country, I needed to do something to help calm that fear, to help that broken heart. There's a healing power in service work and I know where my freedom comes from. It comes at a cost. We don't have a draft for the military or first responders. They volunteer for the freedoms we all get to enjoy and the safe communities we live in. With every ounce of energy within me, I will continue to try and do my part to ensure that we always remember where our precious freedom comes from and that the sacrifices made to protect that freedom are never forgotten or taken for granted. This is a great country. We have a lot to be thankful for. In these turbulent times, it's easy to forget that. I'm truly a grateful American."

Councilwoman Lovisolo stated that she's also a grateful American and I want to thank all of you who serve, protect, and defend. We owe you our eternal gratitude. Thank you.

Councilwoman Liz Homan - Second to Finance, Human Resources, Administration and Information Technology and Public Works & Public Utility. Councilwoman Homan stated that she feels like since there are so many residents of Allendale attending tonight, she does want to state the obvious that there's an awful lot of work going on in Allendale on the streets. Much of that has to do with Veolia who is doing digs at any homes that do not have their connection to our watermain identified as to what material it is. It's to fulfill the lead and copper rule and, so, I, personally, am so grateful that Allendale did vote to sell the system to Veolia because to undertake that project is enormous. So, I know it is inconvenient to all of us and we do have the county paving going on at Franklin Turnpike, but all of those lines needed to be dug up to check and see what they were beforehand. So, again, apologies to everybody for the traffic challenges, but it is all for the good purpose of ensuring that every home is free from lead or galvanized connections. If they are found, Veolia will, free of a direct charge, facilitate the change of the line into a homeowner's home. I had it done at my house, and it was very smooth. Again, thank you for your patience. We do continue to work on some outstanding items on the sale of the water. Veolia still has some monies, but we are working well together and with the government entities, Green Acres, and the like to resolve that.

As far as sewer updates, I will reserve it for the next council meeting.

Thank you to each one of the individuals that have served and are currently serving in the military and to your family and your friends that support you.

Councilman Joseph Daloisio – Councilman Joseph Daloisio - Public Works & Public Utility

Councilman Daloisio stated he wants to echo everything that the council people have said tonight. I'm very appreciated and thankful for every who has served and continues to serve. Our Armed Forces are something that's very special to me, to our nation, our first responders. Thank you to all of you for being here tonight and celebrating with us. This is a very special day for all of us to be able to do this. Thank you for being here.

The DPW committee met today. Some of the things that DPW is working on is preparing for the "Dine the 'Dale". They are going to be cleaning downtown tomorrow. Our superintendent has been assessing potholes around the borough with our borough engineer. He's preparing some more roads for possible paving repairs. We're going to try to start a program to do a little bit every year to get those back up to where they need to be. He's investigating a service that has equipment that comes and scans the roads and gives a printout. He has a presentation coming to see what the cost is and what kind of software it is, so we're going to take a look at that. More to follow on that.

As usual, Andy has been addressing our residents' issues. I think he's been very responsive. He's been very courteous. If anyone has any issues, please don't hesitate to contact the DPW. He is keeping a list. He only had two calls these past few weeks, which is good, but that varies. If you see something, say something.

Ray Frasier of the DPW retired. We had a nice lunch for him. Now that our contract is settled, we do have two new seasonal employees that are coming on. They are on our consent agenda. We are advertising for replacement employees. DPW performed some repairs in our library. They are almost complete. Assessment of our baseball fields are ongoing. We are trying to bring those back up to the standards of where they used to be years ago. They are usable, but there's a lot more work to be done. More to follow on that. Crestwood is up and running. Routine maintenance and the water quality is being monitored on a regular basis. We replaced the diving board that was found to be damaged. The drain cleaning that was performed on Orchard and Crescent continues. Those roads typically flood. I think the cleaning that's been done and will continue to be done has mitigated the closures and the amount of flooding. It seems like the water is moving faster and getting out quicker.

Last summer or fall, we did a dirt giveaway. We do have a big pile of woodchip mulch that's down by the DPW. We're going to plan another free day for residents to come down and help themselves with woodchips. Take all you want.

Alison Altano, CFO/Business Administrator stated the estimated tax bills for the third quarter of 2024 were mailed out yesterday. Final bills will be mailed once we receive the final rate from the county. At the end of June, we will have an intern from Northern Highlands Regional High School, Gabriel Kay, joining us for the summer.

He's highly interested in municipal government and is eager to learn more about the inner workings of the borough, which will include his attendance at our Mayor and Council meetings. We're very excited to have him be a part of the borough for the next few months.

We are currently looking for a full-time Administrative Assistant in our clerk's office. The ad has been posted. If anyone is interested, you can send your resume my way. I just want to thank those who have and continue to serve our country.

John Gil, Director of Communications, stated that he's compiling the June newsletter. Please get me anything by tomorrow. It was great working with the clerk's staff during the elections. It was a long day and everyone did well. The board workers were fantastic. I was down at the firehouse all day checking in and they were fantastic. We can't do elections without board workers. MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Wilczynski stated that 210 West Crescent Avenue, the Allendale Community Center is coming along. There's going to be a walkthrough tomorrow and I'll do another video. I think some of the walls are going to come up so the residents will really get a good feel for the different rooms. Our project manager, Chuck, is in the audience today. He's been invaluable to the Borough of Allendale. Thank you, Chuck, for all your work.

I've had two mayors' meetings since our last council meeting. They all focus on fair share housing. I will be speaking about Fair Share Housing a lot. I think it's very important that everybody educates themselves on this mandate that's getting passed out to Allendale. We are most likely looking at potentially 1,000 units that we'll have to build in Allendale if the projected numbers are correct. Saddle River is proposing 400 units literally right on our border and they want to use our sewer line. We have formed a team, hired experts for guidance and we're going to try to preserve Allendale the way that we all know and love it.

These kids are so courageous and brave, and their service is so vital to the security of our nation and the ultimate goal of peace. On behalf of myself and the rest of the council we are so happy to be able to celebrate you all for the second time in Allendale. We plan on carrying this forward. I've been working with military moms, Jenn Winters and Joanne Hart and Military Dads, Joe Hart and Dan Winters and I'd really like to thank them all for their help in all of this. I want to thank them for their help in all of this. I'd like to thank our staff for the wonderful decorations in the council chambers for Armed Forces Day.

Mayor Wilczynski read the proclamation into the record:

Proclamation in Honor of ARMED FORCES APPRECIATION DAY

WHEREAS, the armed forces of the United States serve as a unified team, at home and across the seas, in the pursuit of a durable peace; and

WHEREAS, our military members do not swear allegiance to an individual, group, or political party. Their oath is to the United States Constitution. By bringing together people from different races, religions, and sexual orientations and melding them into a cohesive fighting force, our military embodies the promise of our democratic experiment; and

WHEREAS, the sacrifices that such members of the United States Armed Forces and of the family members that support them, have preserved the liberties that have enriched this nation making it unique in the world community; and

WHEREAS, we are here today to celebrate as Armed Forces Day for those American men and women in uniform who serve selflessly to preserve democracy and freedom at home and around the world in times of war and peace, and,

WHEREAS, since 1949, the third Saturday of May has been proclaimed Armed Forces Day by the President of the United States and Commander-In-Chief. Calling all Americans to remember those who gave their lives in defense of freedom and to honor the men and women of all of our Armed Services who have served and are now serving our Country, together with their families.

NOW, THEREFORE we, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, NJ, do hereby recognize **ARMED FORCES APPRECIATION DAY** as a special day to show appreciation for our Military and encourage all citizens to display flags, ribbons, and/or personal messages to show their gratitude throughout the year.

B. Guest Speakers:

Tim Latterner - Retired US Army Officer and FBI Special Agent and Former Allendale Police Officer. Mayor Wilczynski stated, Tim was listed in the US Army from 1983 to 1985. He was a US Army Commissioned Officer from 1987 to 1990. Combat veteran in a Panama invasion from 1989 to 1990. Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan. He also attended the following military school. Airborne, Ranger, Pathfinder and he was assigned to the Second Infantry Division, Korea, Paratrooper, Fort Bragg, North Carolina. Tim was an agent in the FBI for over 20 years. He was an instructor responsible for firearms, defensive tactics and tactical training. He has trained swat teams, military law enforcement as well as civilians. Always in service he recently provided free training to Allendale residents and businesses in an active shooter preparedness seminar.

Tim Latterner stood up and presented a speech.

Mr. Latterner thanked Amy and the town council for having him come here tonight. It's a privilege and honor for me to recognize those brave men and women who have served, will serve in the future and are currently serving. It is really an honor to see that the town is coming out to show support for those brave warriors that are overseas and state side trying to preserve democracy and freedom for all of us.

Freedom requires a level of sacrifice to protect, and we'll never know. I can tell you the brave men and women who have served they know what it takes. They know what it's about. It can get bloody in combat, and it also can become very, very difficult even at peacetime upon deployment and things like that. Not only do they sacrifice, but their family's sacrifice and their loved one's sacrifice. So, to show them support from the communities that they come from is truly inspirational and motivational for them. I only know that because I had the privilege of not only serving as a listed soldier, but in leading our troops and, in further, leading them in combat right where the mission is to really stop really bad people from doing really bad things to really good people. That's really what it comes down to. To increase the survivability of our most precious asset, which is our people. That is what it is all about. They understand that sacrifice and it's great to know that they know that there's support for them from all the towns that they come from.

Freedom is something that's enjoyed by all, but it is earned by few. Those are the few who are willing to stand up and defend this great country and continue for all of us to enjoy the freedoms that they're willing to sacrifice everything for. We saw that on Memorial Day.

People who gave the ultimate sacrifice. It is super critical that the mayor and council do events like this because young soldiers overseas, it means the world to them because they want to get back to where they came from. They want to make sure it's the same place they left. It's truly an inspiration to see everybody here tonight.

I started my career as an enlisted soldier. Some of the unique things that I saw about community was, my first assignment was in the 2nd Infantry Division many years ago when the Olympics were going on. I saw that there's North Koreans and South Koreans and the South Koreans were so happy to have us there because they enjoyed their freedom. They enjoyed the democracy they had. That is what these brave men and women who are serving now, will serve and served in the past understand. I went to Fort Bragg and had the tremendous responsibility leading soldiers in combat as far as when we invaded Panama to unseat Dictator Manuel Noriega from the atrocities he was committing on his own people. I saw firsthand the people of Panama City. The people of Rio Hato. The people of Tocumen. Very similar to the people of Mahwah, Ramsey, Ho-Ho-Kus and Allendale. They wanted their freedom. And who was there to give them that freedom and protect them was our brave men and women who continued to do it, had done it historically and will always do it in the future and now as we stand here.

When I left the military, I became a police officer right here in Allendale. So, I understand the community and I give a great shout out to Mike Dillon and all the members of the Allendale Police Department that I was proud to be a part of. To all our emergency responders, our Fire Department, our Ambulance Corp because that's why people can sleep at night. Because they're out there doing what they need to do to keep you safe.

Once I left the police department, I went to the FBI. I was fortunate enough to get in and spend 27 years there. I will tell you that the nine years on our tactical team, I deployed to places where I've seen really violent things. What mankind can do to other mankind is incredible. I deployed to African during a bombing in Kenya and Tanzania and I saw those people just screaming for support for help. And who was there to supply it, the brave men and women of the FBI embedded with the brave men and women of the military. I saw that first-hand. They were victims. Then we deployed, which will mean a lot to many people here on Armed Forces Day, which we're celebrating, I deployed to Yemen for the bombing of the USS Cole. 17 soldiers killed that day. We were going to make retribution for those soldiers that were lost.

I think what we all remember is the sacrifice, not only in combat, but in peacetime. They understand that. 9-11 happened. I was down there that morning. I saw people jump from the buildings, in the smoke, in the soot, and trying to get people out into a safe area. That day we lost two squad members and many, many police officers. We are still losing brave Americans from 9-11 related illness almost 23 years later. Those are the brave men and woman. That's the American spirit that places like Allendale showing their support of community means a tremendous amount.

Because that is why they do what they do. They do it for the person to their left and right. But they also do it for you, the community. That they so want to have the same freedoms and democracy that they enjoyed when they were here. Kudos again to all of you for being here. I will tell you that was what motivated a lot of Americans to enlist when 9-11 happened. I deployed as an FBI swat guy embedded with the Navel Special Warfare Unit and we went up along the Pakistani border and we targeted high value targets. Our goal was we're never going to allow this to happen on our shores again.

To know that this group who supports them is tremendously important.

Freedom requires a level of sacrifice to protect that we'll never know, but everyone here knows. That's why you're sitting here. I truly appreciate what the Mayor and Council did tonight. I truly appreciate all of you, folks, for coming here.

Thomas Hart- Lieutenant US Navy – Mayor Wilczynski stated Lieutenant Hart currently serves as an United States Navy Helicopter Pilot based in San Diego, California. He received his commission through the Navy ROTC program at the University of Notre Dame and completed flight school at Naval Air Station, Whiting Field, in Milton, Florida. He is currently a member of Helicopter Maritime Strike Squadron Seven One (HSM-71) at Naval Air Station North Island, serving as a division officer and flying the MH-60 Seahawk. The Navy's primary anti-submarine and antisurface warfare helicopter. The Raptors of HSM-71 will deploy onboard the Nimitz-class aircraft carrier USS Abraham Lincoln in support of the carrier strikes groups, Western Pacific deployment this summer conducting strategic deterrence and freedom of navigation operation.

Thomas Hart stood up and presented a speech.

I am Tommy Hart. I'd like to first start off with saying thank you for the privilege of getting to speak in front of you all. I am also honored and humbled to follow Mr. Latterner. Growing up in Allendale, Mr. Latterner's career was something that I'd heard of and, ultimately, was a factor and inspired me to grow up to join the service.

To the town council, thank you for having me out here today. I would like to let you know that what you do, serving in advancing the support of service members, veterans and their families in Allendale does not go unappreciated. Any note or message that a soldier, sailor, airmen, or marine gets from their hometown means a lot. If it's someone that's overseas, people who are just living far from home, getting that message from home really brings you back to why you're serving and what you do what you do to protect the American way of life and the way life that we know so well in Allendale, New Jersey.

I'm here to talk about Challenge Coins. An Allendale Challenge coin is in the works. In the US Military, the origin myth of the challenge coin comes from a story about a WWI pilot who was shot down in Germany. His only possession was a Bronz Medallion with his squadron's insignia on it. He's captured by the Germans. He's held behind enemy lines. And, ultimately, he escapes. Returns to the French Lines and they challenge him. They question his identity. They say, who are you, you're a German Spy. And the only way he verifies identity is with a challenge coin bearing his squadron's insignia. With that, it saves his life ultimately proving he is who he claims he is.

Today, military commands often create challenge coins with their unit insignia and their virtues, what they stand for. These coins are awarded to individuals as a token of individual achievement or an award at the end of a tour for an individual. The coins are also generally collected and then traded between people as a form of currency. On a ship you can have challenge coins traded for patches or anything, really.

Lieutenant Thomas Hart explained the rules that correspond to having challenge coins.

Lieutenant Thomas Hart presented the Mayor and Council with challenge coins as a thank you for everything they do for US service members, families, and veterans.

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF THIRD STREET, BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE, COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AND CONVEYING SUCH VACATED LANDS TO CRAIG JOHN FOSTER AND LESLIE VIENNA FOSTER, HUSBAND AND WIFE, AS THE ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNERS

WHEREAS, Third Street is a street located in the Borough of Allendale (the "Borough"); and

WHEREAS, a portion of Third Street (said portion being referred to herein as the "Vacation Street") is located immediately adjacent to Block 1703, Lot 11 in the Borough on the Official Tax Map of the Borough of Allendale which is owned by Craig John Foster and Leslie Vienna Foster, husband and wife (the "Fosters"); and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Borough that the Vacation Street be conveyed to the Fosters who are the immediately adjacent landowner; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Allendale has determined that the Vacation Street as (1) depicted in that "Final As-Built Survey" prepared by Lakeland Surveyors dated August 3, 2022, and last revised on October 25, 2023, said portion being referred to in said survey of "Portion of Row of Third Street Proposed to Be Vacated and Added to Lot 11", a copy of which survey is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and (2) further described that metes and bound description attached hereto as Exhibit "B", is not needed as a public street, and to convey the Vacation Street to the Fosters in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE #24-07

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that within sixty (60) days after this Ordinance becomes effective, the Borough Clerk shall file a copy thereof, certified by her, under the Seal of the Borough of Allendale to be a true copy of such Ordinance, together with a proof of publication thereof, in the office of the Bergen County Clerk to be recorded in a book with proper index to be provided for this purpose entitled "vacations", in accordance with the provisions of N.I.S.A. 40:67-21; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication in accordance with applicable law.

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

THE ALLENDALE MURAL PROJECT INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR SERVICES AGREEMENT

This services agreement ("*Agreement*") is entered into with effect from January 1, 2024 (*Effective Date*) by and between:

PacificLink Builders LLC, a New Jersey limited liability company with its principal place of business located at 52 Pittis Avenue, Allendale, NJ 07401 (*Contractor*), for the services of the Contractor's Managing Member, Simon Rigg (*Artist*); and

The Borough of Allendale, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey (the "Borough") having an address of 500 West Crescent Avenue, Allendale, NJ 07401 (the Contractor and the Borough each being referred to herein as a "party" and together are referred to herein as the "parties").

Acknowledgements:

- (a) The Borough of Allendale is coordinating with the Contractor who will design, facilitate and install a mural ("Mural") in the downtown district of Allendale, New Jersey ("Project"). The Project is referred to as The Allendale Mural Project. The Project was conceived and created by the Artist and is depicted in the Artist's drawings in <u>Schedule A</u>.
- (b) The Borough is supportive of the Project and has previously provided in kind support and permissions as required during the development phase of the Project.
- (c) The Project requires the active engagement of students at Hillside Elementary School (*Elementary School*), Brookside School (*Middle School*) and Northern Highlands Regional High School (*High School*), which may be referred to collectively as the "*Schools*"). The Schools are all within the Borough of Allendale.
- (d) The Mural is commissioned for the benefit of the Borough and the participating students who attend the Schools.
- (e) The Mural is to be installed on the wall on the right side of that certain building located at 87 West Allendale Avenue, Allendale, NJ (the "Building").

The above parties agree as follows:

1. Services. The Contractor will provide the services and deliverables specified in the Timeline and Budget attached hereto as Schedule B (the "Timeline and Budget"). The Timeline and Budget also incorporates and reflects the Contractor's Scope of Work ("SOW"), i.e. the services and deliverables to be provided by the Contractor in connection with the Project. The Contractor shall source, produce, fabricate and cause the installation of the Mural on the Building, as an educational project to be conducted with the engagement of the students of the Schools in accordance with the timeline set forth in the Timeline and Budget. Delivery dates in the Timeline and Budget are estimates based on lead times assessed by the Contractor in good faith at the time of drafting the Timeline and Budget. The Contractor represents and acknowledges that the services performed and deliverables provided under this Agreement will be done using equipment provided by the Contractor, and at hours and times as determined by the Contractor. The Contractor is engaged in providing these

types of services and deliverables for persons or entities other than the Borough, and the Contractor is not required to provide services and deliverables exclusively to the Borough during the term of this Agreement. For the avoidance of doubt, the Contractor is authorized to postpone any phase of the services at any time pending receipt of funds past due.

2. <u>Source of Funds and Payment</u>.

The parties hereto agree and acknowledge that the source of funds for payments to the Contractor provided for herein are from public donations made to the Borough of Allendale and from other public-fundraising efforts.

The Borough has agreed to hold such funds as may be delivered to it in an account (the "Donations Account") from which the Borough shall make payments to the Contractor as provided for in this Agreement.

3. Third Party Consents; Contractor's Engagement of Structural Engineer and Installer.

(a) The Contractor is responsible for securing as may be necessary or required for or in connection with the Project, all written consents from (i) the Schools and (ii) the Borough of Allendale, including but not limited to all building and construction permits.

(b) The Borough is responsible for securing in writing (i) the consent of the owner of the Building for the installation of the Mural on the Building by the Contractor (or by a third party engaged by the Contractor for such purpose) and (ii) the consent from the owner of that certain lot (the "Adjacent Lot") immediately adjacent to the lot the Building, which Adjacent Lot has a street address of 91 West Allendale Avenue, Allendale, NJ, or from the lessee of the Adjacent Lot, for the use of the front grass portion only of the Adjacent Lot, in connection with the installation of the Mural on the Building. Contractor agrees and acknowledges that no work of any kind is to be performed at or on the Building or on the Adjacent Lot unless and until the Borough has confirmed in writing to the Contractor that it has received the written consents set forth in this Section 3(b).

(c)(i) Contractor acknowledges and agrees that the services of a structural engineer are required to establish and affirm, by way of a written report from such structural engineer, that the installation of the Mural on the Building is safe, and will not negatively impact or in anyway compromise the structural integrity of the Building.

- (ii) Contractor further acknowledges and agrees that it shall be solely responsible for (A) retaining and entering into a contract with to structural engineer (the "Structural Engineer") of its choosing who is properly licensed in the State of New Jersey, and (B) obtaining the abovereferenced satisfactory structural engineering services and written report. Any and all information required by the Structural Engineer concerning the Mural, including but not limited to the weight and dimensions of the Mural, and its installation on the Building, shall be provided exclusively by the Contractor to the Structural Engineer.
- (iii) Contractor further acknowledges and agrees that any monies to be paid by to the Structural Engineer are included within the monies from the Donations Account as provided for in this Agreement, and that such monies owed to or payable to the Structural Engineer are included within the Cost Cap and the Budget, as such terms are defined herein below.

(iv) Contractor further acknowledges and agrees that no work related to the actual installation of the Mural on the Building shall commence or occur by any person unless and until (A) the Contractor it has received and provided to the Borough a structural engineering report, referenced in Section 3(c)(i) hereinabove, from the Structural Engineer and (B) any and all permits and/or approvals requested or required by the Borough of Allendale (including but not limited to the Borough of Allendale Building Department and/or the Construction Code Official) relating to the Mural and its installation on the Building have been unconditionally issued and received by the person/entity performing such installation.

(d)(i) Contractor acknowledges and agrees that the services of a person/entity (the "Installer") to perform the actual installation of the Mural on the Building will be required.

(ii) Contract further acknowledges and agrees that it shall be solely responsible for retaining and entering into a contract with and making payment to, an Installer of Contrator's own choosing, provided however, that such Installer is a contractor licensed in the State of New Jersey to perform such installation services. Any and all information required by the Installer concerning the Mural and its installation on the Building, shall be provided exclusively by the Contractor to the Installer.

(iii) Contractor further acknowledges and agrees that any monies to be paid by the Contractor to an Installer are included within the monies to be transferred from the Donations Account as provided for in this Agreement, and that such monies owed to or payable to an Installer are included within the Cost Cap and the Budget, as such terms are defined herein. As such, Contractor shall have the sole responsibility to make from such monies any and all payments that be owed to the Installer for his/her services referenced herein.

4. <u>Project Fees; Budget; Estaimated Payment Schedule; and Scope of Work</u>.

(a) The breakdown of all costs of the Project and the payment thereof is set forth in Schedule B. The Timeline and Budget also incorporates and reflects the Scope of Work ("SOW") to be provided by the Contractor hereunder, including but not limited to all labor, materials and equipment. For purposes of clarity, while the actual services to be performed and/or materials to be provided by the Structural Engineer and an Installer are not within the Contractor's SOW, Contractor shall be solely responsible for the retention of, and payment of, said persons/entities as provided for in this Agreement.

(b) The parties hereto agree and acknowledge that the timing of payments contemplated in the Timeline and Budget are contingent upon, and subject to, adequate monies being on deposit in the Donations Account, which are sufficient for such payments. In the event that, at the time of any payment requested by the Contractor pursuant to the Timeline and Budget, sufficient funds have not been delivered to the Borough and deposited by the Borough in the Donations Account to pay to the Contractor the requested payment, the time within which any such payments are to be made shall be extended until such time as funds sufficient for the Borough to make such payment have been received by the Borough and deposited by the Borough in the Donations Account.

- (c) Contractor agrees and acknowledges that as a condition precedent for payment from the Donations Account under this Agreement, it shall periodically, but in no event more than one time per calendar month, provide to the Borough written invoices and such other documentation as may be reasonably required by the Borough, when requesting payment as per the Timeline and Budget.
- (d) Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary except as provided in Section 5 herein regarding Change Orders, the total costs and monies to be paid pursuant to this Agreement to the Contractor, inclusive of services and materials provided by the Contractor in the SOW, as well as all monies to be paid by the Contractor to the Structural Engineer and the Installer, shall not exceed the sum of One Hundred Sixty Thousand and 00/100 (\$160,000.00) Dollars (said \$160,000.00 being referred to herein as the "Cost Cap").
- (e) For purposes of clarity, the sole obligation of the Borough under this Agreement is to make payments to Contractor from the Donations Account upon the terms and conditions specifically set forth herein.

5.Change Orders. In the event that an increase to the SOW, or to the services and deliverable hereunder, is caused by any revisions to the scope or timeline of the Project, or to the nature or extent of the services required of the Contractor in connection with the Project, which revisions the parties hereto have mutually agreed will result in any costs in excess of the Cost Cap (the "Changes") the Contractor will, provided the Contractor and the Borough are in mutual agreement as to same, negotiate in good faith with the Borough as to any such adjustments in the Project Fee, in excess of the Cost Cap or delivery / installation dates as a result of the Changes. Where desired by either party, the Contractor will issue a revised Timeline and Budget to incorporate the Changes and reflect the(i) mutually agreed upon the terms associated with such Changes, and (ii) the specific dollar amount in excess of the Cost Cap to be paid in connection with the Changes and (iii) a revised payment schedule (the "Revised Payment Schedule") reflecting the payment dates associated with or resulting from the Changes and/or payments for the Changes. The Contractor shall not be required to commence work on the Changes until the the Borough has (a) signed off on the revised Timeline and Budget, if any; and (b) paid any additional fees required in line with the Revised Payment Schedule.

6.Ownership; Intellectual Property; Credit.

(a) <u>Ownership</u>: The Borough shall own the Mural. The Artist shall retain the copyright in the design of the Mural and any original element embodied therein, including the shape of the Mural and the decorative or functionality elements affixed onto, or incorporated into, the Mural.

(b) <u>Trademarks</u>. The Artist is authorized to identify the Borough as a client on its website, social media platforms and other promotional materials and the Borough's trademarks in connection with such identification where applicable.

(c) <u>Credit</u>. The Artist shall be credited in all of the Borough's promotional materials relating to the Project, and identified as the creator and designer of the Mural in any public statements, oral or

written, pertaining to the Project. The Project shall include a plaque identifying the Artist in such fashion as the parties deem appropriate.

7.Limitation of Liability. The Contractor agrees that neither the Borough, nor any of the officials, elected officials, officer, employees, contractor or agents of the Borough shall be liable to Contractor or any third party for any actions, damages, claims, liabilities, costs, expenses or losses in any way arising out of or relating to the (i) services performed, or material, provided, by the Contractor under this Agreement, or (ii) the services performed, or materials provided, by either the Structural Engineer or an Installer and Contractor hereby agrees to indemnify and defend the Borough against any and all such claims asserted by any third person or entity, unless caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Borough. The Liability of the Contract ceases on completion at handover the mural then becoming the responsibility of the Borough.

8.Insurance. Both parties agree to maintain general liability insurance of no less than \$1M per incident and \$2M in the aggregate in connection with the Project, and the parties will exchange certificates of insurance as may be reasonably required by the other party naming each party as an additional insured of the other party. The Contractor's insurance shall be the primary insurance in connection with any claim arising out of the Project, except to the extent arising solely from the negligent act or negligent omission of the Borough.

9.Force Majeure. Any delay or failure in the performance by the Contractor under this Agreement shall be excused if, and to the extent, caused by the occurrence of fires, floods, explosions, riots, wars, hurricane, sabotage, terrorism, vandalism, governmental acts, labor strikes, pandemics and other such events that are beyond the reasonable control of the Contractor.

10.Term. The Term of this Agreement shall begin on the Effective Date and shall continue until the Project is completed or abandoned with the consent of both parties. Contractor may not terminate this Agreement except for a material breach by the Borough of its obligations pursuant to this Agreement provided however that Contractor must give the Borough thirty (30) days prior written notice of alleged breach, and if the alleged breach is cured or rectified within said thirty (30) days period, no such breach shall be deemed to have occurred. In the event of any breach of the Agreement by the Borough, the Contractor's sole remedy shall for the payment of those monies found to be owed to the Contractor hereunder. The Borough may terminate this Agreement for any reason upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the Contractor, provided that the Borough shall pay the Contractor from the Donations Account any outstanding compensation due pursuant to the Timeline and Budget within fifteen (15) days of receipt of the final invoice that sets forth prorated Project Fee based on services actually provided, materials used and expenses / third party obligations incurred for the Project.

11.Representations and Warranties.

(a) The Contractor warrants and represents that all designs contributed to the Project are original to the Contractor, and do not infringe the intellectual property rights of any third parties.

(b) The parties each warrant and represent that they are not a party to any contract with any third party that would impair their ability to perform any of the obligations pursuant to this Agreement.

(c) The undersigned signatories for each of the parties warrant and represent that they are duly authorized to enter into the Agreement on behalf of such party and by their signature to bind that party.

12.No Partner or Joint Venture Relationship. This Agreement is NOT intended to establish either the Contractor or the Borough as a partner, joint venturer, agent or employee of the other party for any purpose. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to establish a partnership, joint venture, agency or employment relation between the Borough, and the Contractor. Each party is solely responsible for payment of any and all income taxes payable in connection with monies received by such party as a result of this Agreement or otherwise, and for compliance with all labor laws and workers compensation and disability insurance obligations applicable to the assignment of personnel to the Project.

13.Notices. All notices by any party shall be sent by overnight mail and addressed to the other party at the mailing address set forth on the first page of this Agreement or to such other address as the party may from time to time designate in writing for this purpose, with a copy to be sent via email on the day of mailing to the contact person from the other party who is assigned to the Project. The contact person and email address for the Contractor is Simon Rigg, email is simonriggstudio@gmail.com. The contact person and email address for the Borough is Alison Altano, having an email address of <u>alisonaltano@allendalenj.gov</u>.

14.General. This Agreement sets forth the entire understanding of the parties in connection with the Project and may not be modified except by a written document signed by all parties. This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the advance written consent of the other party. In the event that any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will not in any way be affected or impaired thereby. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey, and the all claims or disputes between the parties arising out of or related to this Agreement, and the venue, for the resolution of any such claims or dispute shall be the Superior Court of New Jersey, Bergen County, New Jersey. In the event of any such claim or dispute that arises out of this Agreement, the parties shall make a good faith effort to resolve such dispute through mediation prior to the commencement of any litigation. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, and photocopies or scanned signatures shall be as valid and binding as if they were original signatures.



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale that the Memorandum of Understanding as between the Borough and the Union for the term January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2027, the terms of which are incorporated by reference herein, be and hereby is **APPROVED**; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor, the Chief Financial Officer and the Borough Attorney are authorized to take all appropriate actions so as to implement this Resolution.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE AND LOCAL 11, AFFILLIATED WITH THE INTERNATIONAL BROTHERHOOD OF TEAMSTERS

It is hereby agreed by and between the negotiation committee of the Borough of Allendale (the "Borough") and LOCAL 11, Affiliated with the International Brotherhood of Teamsters ("Union"), as follows:

WHEREAS, the parties above have previously engaged in negotiations in good faith in an effort to arrive at a successor agreement to the Collective Negotiating Agreement between the Employer and the Union which expired on December 31, 2023 (the "2020 -2023 CNA"); and,

WHEREAS, as a result of such prior negotiations, the negotiation committees for the parties wish to memorialize the proposed terms of agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, and in consideration of the mutual covenant contained herein, the parties hereinabove referred hereby stipulated and agree as follows:

1. The provisions of this Memorandum of Understanding are subject to ratification by the respective parties to the contract.

2. The signatories below agree to recommend this Memorandum of Understanding for ratification by their respective constituencies.

3. A copy of this Memorandum has been furnished to representatives of the Borough and the Union.

4. All proposals not covered herein made by either party during the course of negotiations have been deemed withdrawn.

5. All provisions of the prior Agreement shall be carried forward except as hereinafter provided.

6. Unless otherwise notified, all dates involving the duration of the Agreement shall be conformed to the duration of this proposed negotiated Memorandum of Understanding.

7. Standby (Article IX) – Effective January 1, 2024, employees on standby shall be compensated when they are assigned to standby duty at the rate of:

In addition to the foregoing salary increases, all covered employees shall receive the following salary increases effective January 1st of each year:

2024 – 3% 2025 – \$300 plus 4% 2026 – \$300 plus 4% 2027 – \$300 plus 4%

9. Salaries and Wages (Article X) – Effective January 1, 2024, the Step Guide attached hereto will be incorporated into the contract, with salary increases retroactive to such date.

Employer shall have the ability to hire new employees, in its discretion up to Step 3 on the Step Guide, in which event, any Employee receiving a lesser salary shall have his salary increased to the same step as the newly hired Employee.

A separate title of "Mechanic/Laborer" shall be added to the contract with a salary range of \$60,000 to \$80,000 per year. In the event that such position is filled, the hiring salary shall be subject to a 4% per year increase during calendar years 2025 - 2027.

Any employee hired prior to January 1, 2024 attaining a CDL license during the term of this contract shall receive a \$2,000 increase to base salary.

Employer, in its discretion, shall have the right to award a "merit increase", payable as a stipend, on an annual basis not to exceed \$500.

10. Holidays (Article XII) – Effective January 1, 2024, employees shall receive one (1) "floating holiday" in addition to the ten (10) recognized holidays set forth in the existing contract. The use of the floating holiday shall be subject to DPW Superintendent approval, not to be unreasonably withheld.

11. Uniforms and Safety Equipment (Article XXI) – The uniform and safety boot allowance shall be increased as follows:
