ADMINISTRATION:

Staff Reports:

Alison Altano, BA/CFO, thanked Mr. Lerch for his budget presentation. There's not much more for me to say about the budget. The borough is in a great financial position. Our tax rate is continuously decreasing. We're constantly ensuring we're fiscally responsible. The amount to be raised by taxation increased only 1 percent. We're collecting just over 11 million dollars. We only increased it by \$41,000 from last year.

It's largely due to our increase in surplus as he discussed. Their increases and appropriations and our increases in other municipal revenues. The budget newsletter is filled with everything we possibly thought would be informative to the residents in terms of anything large that occurred this year and anything that we're seeing moving forward. I want to thank Mayor Wilczynski and the Finance Committee, Councilwoman Lovisolo and Councilwoman Homan.

Over the last two years since I've worked here we've all worked hard together and diligently to really go through the municipal budget and the finances, and I feel that all the work that we put together we're going into 2025 with a very solid budget. And not just for 2025, but it has really set us up for many years to come between the capital, the reserve we were able to accumulate this year. We're really in a good place.

Lastly, I just want to thank Chief Dillon and his officers for organizing such a great bring your child to work today.

Linda Louise Cervino, Municipal Clerk stated that Crestwood Lake registration opens April 29th. The Municipal Clerk's office will be open until 9 p.m. on May 8th and May 20th to accommodate the residents. We also have three notaries in the municipal clerk's office. More importantly, the Financial Disclosure Statements are due April 30th.

June 3rd is the deadline to apply for a mail-in ballot by mail. Early voting period is June 3rd through June 8. You can find more information on elections on our borough website.

Michael Dillon, Police Chief, stated we have our reaccreditation inspection next week. That's a two-day event. Much like the budget being audited, our entire department gets audited every three years. It's compared to Best Practices through the New Jersey State Chief's Association. I'll be at a hearing at some point to respond to any inquiries the panel may have. Historically, it's gone smoothly, no issues. We work very closely with an accreditation agency, a project manager, so, everything looks good and promising, and we'll be good for another three years. It's a tremendous amount of work, but, I do think it proves its worth with our insurance premiums and operationally. We're looking forward to putting that behind us.

On May 3rd at noon, Allendale Recreation Commission's opening day ceremonies begin for baseball and softball. I'm happy to announce that Mark Dunn will be throwing out the first pitch.

Timothy J. Wiss, Borough Attorney, congratulated the governing body on the budget. You're in great shape. We continue to protect the borough from litigations and as the mayor indicated we're successful in at least in recovering some funds in some of the other litigations. The cell tower revenue is coming in. We're going to go out with another RFP eventually, but this is revenue that we didn't have before.

Andrew Agugliaro, DPW Superintendent, was not present.

Council Committee Reports

Councilman Yaccarino, Facilities, Parks and Recreation/Land Use and Construction Code, stated the siding is up on the concession stand. We are on track. We are going to be receiving bids on May 20th. We booked a couple bands already. Field 3 is almost ready to play ball.

Linda Cervino said that the bid notice for the concession stand will be in the April 30th edition of The Record.

Councilwoman Elizabeth Homan, Finance, Human Resources, Administration and Information Technology, Public Works & Public Utility, stated the budget was very thorough. Thank you to the Allendale Police Department for the program that you had at the high school before these kids are out regarding drinking and driving. Officer Dunn also spoke there. Mike Dillon said Officer Dunn's car is up there in front. Councilpresident Homan said it's such an important message. Everyone did such a great job, so, thank you and all the departments that were involved in putting that together.

From a water/sewer standpoint, our budget is difficult to manage, and we've also spent a lot of money on managing some of the legal issues that we've had and continue to have around the sewers and how we can ensure that Allendale sewers are used appropriately by outside communities as they're being urged and forced to build. But we must make sure that we are using legal and engineering means to ensure that it's appropriate for the Allendale infrastructure.

Today was a challenge for the water system, which is owned by Veolia. We have gotten an update at 6:15 p.m. this evening that I want to read in its entirety.

"The boil water advisory remains in effect in Allendale. Customers should continue to boil their water until the advisory is lifted. The boil water advisory was issued on Thursday, April 24, 2025, after a loss of pressure in the Allendale water system. Pressure has been restored. As a part of procedures set by the public health authorities, water samples have been collected, and testing is underway to prove the water is safe to consume. This testing process takes approximately 24 hours. Rushing the process could lead to inaccurate results. Our next update is expected Friday afternoon. We understand that waiting for test results during a boil water advisory can be frustrating and we appreciate your patience. Please know that our top priorities are safety. We are working as quickly and as carefully as possible to resolve the issue. Customers with additional questions can visit mywater.veolia.us or call Veolia customer service at 855-367-6708. Thank you for your understanding and your continued operation."

That was from Veolia. Certainly, I can share with the public that from the Borough and our water and sewer committee that this is a very challenging scenario, and it does happen. We have infrastructure and there are going to be problems. We were on the phone immediately and me, Mike Dillon, Mayor, everybody trying to ensure that information was disseminated and we're here to do the best that we can for each one of our residents. We all live in Allendale, and we appreciate everybody's communication and patience.

Councilman Edward O'Connell, Facilities, Parks and Recreation, thanked everyone for their work on the budget. He stated to Mike Dillon, the police chief, that the demonstration at the high school moved his kids. He hopes that it touched everybody because he knows it was hard for him to see. Councilman O'Connell also stated that the scouts are wrapping up to get paint on the canisters for Crestwood Lake for the garbage and recycling. They are quite heavy and will need help moving them. We are doing red like the barn.

Councilman Joseph Daloisio, Public Works & Public Utility/ Public Safety stated that the DPW committee met April 11th. We talked about the field restoration. Councilman Yaccarino mentioned a little bit about Field 3. The DPW was still going to continue the process to rectify some of the other fields that still need to be done as well as updating the other fields as time goes by. We talked about getting Crestwood reopened and the process is underway right now to get it back for the regular summer season. Ongoing pothole repair in various locations throughout the town. I want to thank Allendale Police. I know they're taking a lot of calls and as they drive they are also making notes of different things they see on the road and relaying that back to our superintendent, Andy, so I appreciate that. It's a nice partnership. We did speak about potentially employing some seasonal employees to help with the summer, so that's ongoing and still being discussed. Some of you may have noticed the paving at the Grandstand. It looks very good. I want to thank the Mayor and our superintendent and our police department for coordinating that during our spring break shutdown to avoid any major issues with parents picking up kids. A lot of you know on West Maple there was a section of sidewalk that was dead ended. So, the kids would walk up West Maple towards Northern Highlands. They would hit a patch of dirt, and they would have to walk in the street for about 30 feet when they would get back onto the sidewalk at Northern Highlands. Andy and some of the guys took it upon themselves to go up there and clear a section of dirt so now the kids can at least walk continually without going in the When school is out, the DPW will be addressing that and try to do more of a permanent fix.

Councilman Matthew O'Toole, Public Safety, was absent.

Councilwoman Susanne Lovisolo, Finance, Human Resources, Administration and Information Technology, Land Use and Construction Code, was absent.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Wilczynski stated that regarding affordable housing, it's ongoing. We did come to our settlement of 200 units down from 260 units. The next deadline is June when we must figure out what our realistic development potential is and then find out where we're going to build it and figure out what we're going to do with the unmet need. I feel like it's getting a little bit of attention. There was just an assemblywoman from South Jersey that was talking to the DCA about how the towns are supposed to build when there is no land. Not really getting traction that way because it really is in the legislature. Allendale is not against affordable housing, but it's that we want to do it in a way that doesn't ruin the fabric of just not our town, but of New Jersey. I keep saying this, it's not necessarily even just now. It's going to be ten years from now or twenty years from now because these unmet need numbers are in the hundreds. We still have hundreds from our third round. We're going to have hundreds from our fourth round. If they think that those are going to get built that means that every developable land, every piece of land, our house, is going to be high density housing. It's absolutely going to change the fabric of New Jersey. Infrastructure cannot handle it. We have flooding as it is. We are already having an infrastructure issue because Saddle River's Fair Share Housing happens to be on Allendale's border. Saddle River does not have the infrastructure for multi-homes. So, they don't have a sewer system.

They use septic tanks. We are very diligently working with them to make sure that our infrastructure is protected because they expect to come through our sewer line. So that is something that is ongoing that we're talking about almost daily with elected officials, attorneys and engineers. It's a big process that we've been going through.

We met with New Jersey Transit. In the next couple of days, you will see new signs for our transit lot. We are redoing the transit lot. We are first starting with some signage. A lot of people do not realize that there are tons of commuter/residential parking there for when people are shopping or going to a restaurant. A lot of times on the weekend it gets a little crowded. So, we're going to try to direct people there. It does need to be paved. It needs to be restriped and better signage. Right now, we have more decorative signs that are going to get people there and then we're going to work out signage where retail people can park and then where the commuter people can park.

We had a Land Use meeting. We just changed two ordinances that we felt weren't keeping up with the character of the town anymore. We plan on looking at the fence ordinance next. We are also going to look at Joe's Land Use packet. We have one version of it started and we're going to meet. It's a user-friendly Land Use packet so when residents come in and they want to do an addition on their house they get this big packet, very intimidating and very confusing. So, we want to make it super user-friendly. Thank you to Councilman Daloisio for starting the ball with this. We're going to take it and try to make it very easy for residents to accommodate them.

Thank you, everybody, with the budget. I want to echo what Councilpresident Homan said about the water. It was a challenging day for us. We know that Veolia is doing the best they can. I know sometimes the messaging does not seem to be as fast as we want it or what we want to hear, but, I do feel that our water system is in the best hands. We would have the same issues or more if Allendale still owned the water system, so, unfortunately, this is what's happening, and we will get to the bottom of it. We are addressing the messaging that's sending out and the timing of it as much as we can.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: None.

NEW BUSINESS: None.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON ANY MATTER:

Walter Widmer, 38 Hamilton Street, Allendale asked if the mayor could elaborate on the water boiling issue. Councilpresident Liz Homan stated that as of 11:30 a.m. we were given a notification by Veolia that since we had lost pressure that a boil water advisory was in effect. You should have received a reverse 911 call as well as a constant contact email. The mayor said they must issue the boiling water announcement by New Jersey State law from the DEP because the water pressure dropped in some areas of town today.

Mr. Widmer asked about the tennis courts. Councilman Yaccarino stated that at the last meeting we approved to the solicitation to advertise for the grant through the county. We worked with our grant writer and our municipal engineer as of last week and all the necessary materials for which we needed to encumber were sent to the grant writer and that was submitted to the county as of this week. We are in good shape to hopefully receive that. That will be a 2026 project.

Mayor Wilczynski stated that she was just down at the mural looking at it. We're hoping to get it installed by June.

Mr. Widmer asked if everyone could use the microphones in front of them.

No one else from the public came forward.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Mayor and Council, on a motion by Councilman Yaccarino, second by Councilwoman Homan and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

Mayor Wilczynski wanted to comment on the bringing your kids to work today. Alison Altano said that our construction code official, Anthony Hackett, took the kids from the borough hall to Crestwood Lake, the Celery Farm, Dairy Queen and The Pretzel Factory.

FINAL ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Mayor and Council, on a motion by Councilman Yaccarino, second by Councilwoman Homan and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned at 8:02 p.m.

ORDINANCE # 25-05

CALENDAR YEAR 2025 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% or the cost of living adjustment, whichever is less, unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, the cost of living adjustment for calendar year 2025 budget is calculated at 2.5% pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale in the County of Bergen finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2025 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$114,420 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2025 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Allendale shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by up to 3.5%, amounting to \$400,469, and that the CY 2025 municipal budget for the

Borough of Allendale be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE COUNTY OF BERGEN STATE OF NEW JERSEY

ORDINANCE # 25-06

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, SUPPLEMENT AND REVISE THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE, ADDITIONS TO NONCONFORMING STRUCTURES, CHAPTER 270–37(A)

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that Chapter 270-37(A) of the Code of the Borough of Allendale, be and hereby is amended, supplemented and revised to add the following provision to said Chapter:

- A. Any nonconforming principal or accessory residential structure may be altered or enlarged without Land Use Board approval, provided that all of the following conditions are met:
 - (1) Use of same is permitted in the district;
 - (2) Such alteration or enlargement complies with all applicable development regulations as defined by this Zoning Code;
 - (3) Such alteration or improvement does not result in any vertical expansion above any existing nonconformity;
 - (4) Such alteration or improvement does not result in the closure or enclosure of any existing, open nonconformity, such as open deck; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that, except as modified herein, all other provisions of Chapter 270 shall remain in full force and effect as previously adopted.

ORDINANCE # 25-08

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 203, "PUBLIC PLACES", ARTICLE III, SECTION 19 "DEFINITIONS" AND SECTION 20 "USE OF RECREATIONAL FACILITIES; FEES; RULES AND REGULATIONS," OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, that the code of the Borough of Allendale is hereby amended as follows to add/modify the following sections only:

§ 203-19 "Definitions"

COMMUNITY CENTER – The name of the premises now officially designated by that name and located at 210 West Crescent Avenue and known and designated as Lot 20 in Block 1005 on the Assessment Map of the Borough of Allendale.

RECREATIONAL FACILITIES

Includes all facilities owned and operated by the Borough of Allendale for recreational purposes, including swimming and other athletic facilities, beach, lake and picnic areas, playgrounds, parks and nature preserves and all areas for parking of vehicles adjoining such recreational facilities. This definition shall also include the Community Center.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, that the code of the Borough of Allendale is hereby amended to read as follows:

§203-20, "Use of recreational facilities; rules and regulations"

- A. Annually, by resolution, unless the Council determines the current fees are sufficient, establish fees to be charged for the use of recreational facilities and participation in recreation programs.
- D. Establish a policy for the use of parks and/or recreation facilities by groups or individuals applying for reserved spaces for such recreation activities as basketball, pickleball, swimming, picnics, and other activities.

F. Establish Rules and Regulations and/or a Code of Conduct for any person or group who uses or enters any park and/or recreation facility.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that, except as modified herein, all other provisions of Chapter 203 remain in full force and effect as previously adopted.
