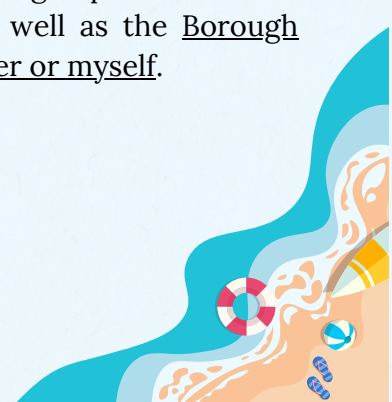

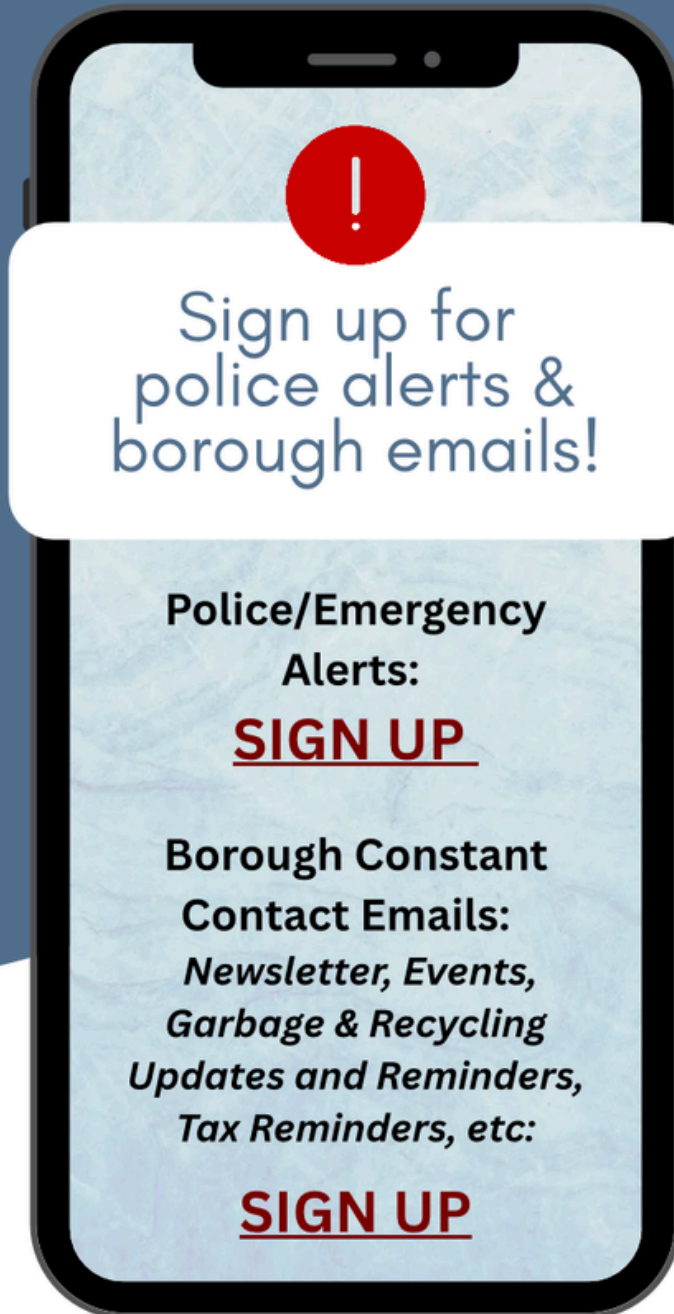

## Understanding 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter Tax Bill

- 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Q preliminary tax bills are based off of prior years' assessments and tax rate (2025).
  - o **WHY?** The municipal budget is not adopted, and we don't have current assessments at that time.
- By law the state requires preliminary taxes of Q1 & 2 of 2026 to be billed at the end of the year with the 4<sup>th</sup> Q 2025 tax bill.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter always seems a little 'heavy' because it is 'making up for Q 1 & 2 if tax rate or assessments increased for the current year. **Multiplying the 3<sup>rd</sup> Q tax bill by 4, is not an accurate reading of your 2026 taxes.**

### How to calculate your estimated 2026 taxes.

$$2026 \text{ Assessed Value} \times 1.906^*/100$$

\* (still estimated because we do not have county increase yet)

Your 2026 assessed value was mailed to you.

You can also access your property assessment on our website: [www.allendalenj.gov](http://www.allendalenj.gov) Go to pay property taxes- enter name and see assessed value.

### Assessment Facts

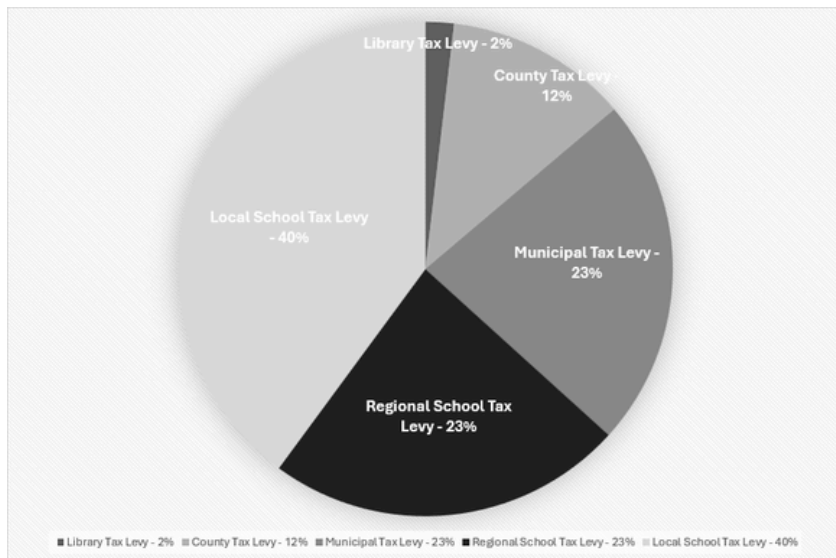
- Overall Assessments were up 10% (this is the highest increase we have had over the last 5 years) although based on the decreased tax rate, the tax impact is not as significant: 60% of residents are expected to see a decrease or small increase (0-\$100) and 40% will receive an increase over \$100
- Allendale is booming with new additions, new homes and other improvements. This in turn increases the overall assessments of the Borough, not only the improved and upgraded homes. The strongest factor when re-assessing homes is the current market which requires towns to reassess homes at full and fair value.

# How Property is Valued for Property Tax Purposes

New Jersey's real property tax is "ad valorem" meaning that each person pays tax based on the value of the property they own.

## Standards for Valuing Property

New Jersey courts have determined "full and fair value," "market value," and "true value" to be synonymous.



**P**roperty is to be assessed for taxation purposes by general laws and uniform rules. All real property must be assessed according to the same standard of value except for agricultural/horticultural land.

True value is the price at which, in the assessor's judgment, real property would sell for at a fair and bona fide sale.



**T** rue market value is the likely price that a property will bring in a competitive market under essential conditions for a fair sale. It assumes that there is a willing buyer and willing seller and neither is negatively influenced; e.g. selling property to finalize a divorce. Market price is the actual amount that is paid for a property. The actual price paid is not always what the property's true value is on the real estate market.

### Sales Comparison

This method determines the market value by comparing similar properties that have been sold in the municipality. The following factors may be used to calculate the value.

- Number of rooms
- Size of the rooms
- Quality of material
- Quality of workmanship
- Physical condition
- Location
- Time of the sale

### Income Approach

This method determines the market value based on the property's income-producing capabilities.

★ All 3 methods should be used when possible in the valuation of every property. One method may be more relevant than the others and given more weight in the valuation process.

### Environmental

- Geography and location

- Surrounding neighbors
- Proximity to schools, churches, stores, transportation

### Physical Characteristics

- Surrounding properties
- Comparable properties
- Subject property in terms of :
  - ⇒ Construction quality
  - ⇒ Age
  - ⇒ Maintenance level
  - ⇒ Depreciation
  - ⇒ Architectural style
  - ⇒ Lot size or acreage

### Government

- Public service e.g. police/fire protection
- Zoning ordinances
- Building codes
- Taxes assessed

## Methods of Valuing Property:

**T** here are 3 methods for determining property value for tax purposes. Selection of a method depends on the nature of the property.



- Cost of replacement
- Market data or sales comparison
- Income approach

### Cost of Replacement

Commonly used for new construction; it estimates the cost of building that structure. The new building is compared with another building that has the same or equal functionality. The land value is added to the cost of the building improvements minus depreciation if not new construction to get the total value of the property.

## Revaluation, Reassessment and Compliance Plans:

### Revaluation/Reassessment

These programs may be needed when there is evidence that properties are not assessed uniformly throughout the taxing district. The intention of the process is to distribute the tax burden equitably amongst taxpayers by assessing each property according to its true value.

### Added Assessment

New construction, structural additions and improvements completed during the tax year are valued and taxed so that the property does not avoid its fair share of the tax burden for the rest of the year.

### Omitted Assessment

An omitted assessments is an assessment, that by error, was not placed on the property at the right time.

### Appeals

Taxpayers who disagree with their property's assessment have the right to file an appeal with their county tax board. The taxpayer can appeal directly with the New Jersey State Tax Court if the property is assessed for more than \$1,000,000.
