A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR AMY WILCZYNSKI

Happy New Year, everyone! I hope you all had a wonderful holiday season. We are gearing up for a great year ahead. We held our Reorganization Meeting on January 5 and are setting ourselves up for a successful 2026.

We began the year putting the DPW to the test with some **major snowstorms**. I think we can all agree, they did a fabulous job clearing the snow in a very timely manner! The fluctuating temperatures combined with aging infrastructure resulted in **two major water main breaks**. Veolia worked around the clock to make repairs with minimal disturbance in traffic or service interruptions. Veolia continues to **locate and replace lead service lines** throughout the Borough and are systematically replacing everyone's meters. In addition, PFOS treatment is now in place in 4 out of the 5 wells. The wells with treatment are **registering as non-detect**.

It has been wonderful to see so many residents using the **Community Center** this winter. It's hard to believe it has only been open for just over a year. We are pleased with how smooth the transition has been and thrilled to see it being used by our local groups, the Allendale Recreation Commission, and residents enjoying activities ranging from mahjong to pickleball. We recently **added new furniture** in the lobby, creating another welcoming gathering space.

With the Community Center and the Crestwood concession stand completed, our major focus this year will be the **overhaul of the tennis courts by the Red Barn**. This is a significant project requiring extensive engineering work. We plan to convert the courts for both tennis and pickleball and add a standalone **basketball court** as well.

We remain committed to keeping open lines of communication with our residents. This year, we will be hosting **four more Town Halls**, along with additional "**Coffee with the Mayor and Council**" events to encourage open, casual conversations. Please remember that we are always available by email and phone. I had many one-on-one meetings with residents over the past year and look forward to continuing those conversations in the year ahead.

This year, we are proud to celebrate **America's 250th anniversary** of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. The Borough will be partnering with local organizations and businesses to promote patriotism and community pride in recognition of this important milestone.

Over the past few years, the Borough has been investigating **sewer costs and inflow and infiltration (I&I) issues**. We will be reinstituting our **sump pump program** and conducting smoke testing in areas where we suspect leakage. More information will be shared soon.

Finally, please be on the lookout for a separate memo regarding our **Fair Share Housing settlement**. The Borough has been working diligently to reach this point, and we look forward to sharing the details with everyone soon!

If you know someone who does not have access to a computer, please let us know so we can mail them Borough updates.



All trees must be free of decorations; tree stands and plastic
disposal bags.

• WEST SIDE COLLECTION:

Weeks of Jan. 5th & Jan. 19th

• EAST SIDE COLLECTION:

Weeks of Jan. 12th & Jan. 26th

Decorative wreaths and garland, held together with wires,
must go with household garbage.

GARBAGE

- Household kitchen, office & bathroom trash

BULKY TRASH

- Furniture
- Carpeting
- Non-metal items
- Windows/mirrors/pane glass must be taped with an "X"

METAL

- Anything that is at least 75% metal, including artificial Christmas trees.

RECYCLING

Container One:

- Newspapers & inserts
- Junk mail, envelopes, office, notebook, construction paper
- Smooth and corrugated cardboard
- Glossy magazines and catalogs
- Soft-covered books and telephone books
- Non-metallic wrapping paper & greeting cards
- Shredded paper
- Brown Grocery bags

Container Two:

- Food & beverage containers
- Plastic containers with a recycling code 1, 2, 5 & 7
- Aluminum cans, foil
- Aseptic packaging (ex. soup, milk containers)
- Metal cans & empty aerosol cans
- Green, clear & brown glass bottles and jars

**Please note that there are 2 separate trucks that pick up recyclables.

STYROFOAM

- EPS #6 Packing foam is recyclable! Stay tuned for the next collection event by the Allendale Green Team.



1721-1798

William Franklin, son of Benjamin Franklin, was the last royalist Governor of New Jersey (1763-1776). John Fell lived in what is now Allendale. He led local opposition to the British during the American Revolution. Although Franklin and Fell likely never crossed paths, their parallel lives provide a unique look at New Jersey in Revolutionary times.
