## A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR AMY WILCZYNSKI

This winter brought some of the most significant storms Bergen County has seen in recent years, with snowfall totals well over two feet. I want to extend my sincere thanks to our DPW Superintendent, Andy Agugliaro, and his entire team for their extraordinary efforts throughout each storm. This was Andy's first big snow storm experience with the Borough, and we received many reports that Allendale's roads were among the best in the area. Looking ahead, it appears we have at least one more week of chilly weather before spring finally arrives.

We have already reached several major milestones in the first quarter of the year. The Borough has finalized its Fourth Round Fair Share Housing obligation, and I am pleased to report a very positive outcome:

- The proposed overlay zone was moved out of our downtown area, with density instead placed on an existing overlay property on Boroline Road.
- The Borough satisfied its affordable housing requirement through deed restriction extensions, meaning no new construction is required in this round.
- We negotiated a separate agreement with Avalon Bay Communities for \$500,000 in off-site improvement funding.

This settlement represents one of the strongest outcomes achieved by municipalities in our region. The Borough is now certified and in good standing for the next ten years. Please look out for a more detailed memo that will be shared within the next week.

Another significant accomplishment this year is the transition to shared dispatch services with Ramsey. Conversations about this partnership began many years ago and became more urgent last year when required upgrades to our system were projected to cost the Borough up to \$700,000, with annual operating costs approaching \$350,000. After careful consideration, detailed analysis, and feasibility studies, joining Ramsey proved to be the best option for the Borough.

This transition will streamline our emergency services while maintaining the same level of responsiveness. Our municipal building lobby will remain open 24/7, and all of our dispatch staff have retained positions with Ramsey. I would like to thank Chief Dillon and Borough Administrator Alison Altano for their hard work in bringing this important initiative to completion.

At our last meeting, we approved part of the capital budget so we can move forward quickly with spring projects once the weather improves. Planned projects include field rehabilitation, a new messaging sign at Borough Hall and implementation of a management system to automate and streamline documents throughout all departments in the Borough. We plan to introduce the operating budget at the March 26th Mayor and Council meeting.

I also attended several mayoral meetings this month, including sessions with Congressman Josh Gottheimer and County Executive Jim Tedesco. The topic of deer management came up during discussions with the County Executive. It was made clear that there is currently not enough support among the county commissioners to proceed with a countywide program. As a result, we have invited three commissioners to attend our next meeting so we can make the case for a regional approach. After attending several presentations on the issue, it is clear that a coordinated regional strategy is necessary for an effective program. I will continue to keep everyone informed as discussions progress.

We have also finalized the 2026 road paving list. The cost of asphalt has nearly doubled in recent years, and we had to adjust some priorities due to storm-related damage. In addition to scheduled paving projects, we will also be aggressively addressing potholes throughout the Borough.

The Community Center continues to thrive, and we encourage residents to look out for new programming on our website and Facebook page.

Finally, congratulations to CS Fit Pilates on their new location on Central Avenue. We held a ribbon cutting earlier this month, and the space looks fantastic. We wish them much success in their new home.

Your Green Team volunteers continue to serve the residents of Allendale by providing the opportunity to recycle materials not collected by the borough. Our efforts make a measurable reduction in municipal trash collections and contribute to the goal of sustainable practices. In February, we added batteries to our recycling collections which are held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of every month at borough hall from 10 AM – noon. 
