A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR AMY WILCZYNSKI

I hope everyone is enjoying the last full month of summer. Some of you are winding down and others are already gearing up as kids start getting ready for college.

We have had a busy summer so far at the Borough, and I'd like to highlight some of the activities and projects that we have been working on.

There have been several infrastructure upgrades initiated by the Borough and in collaboration with county and utility companies. Projects include the repair of West Orchard bridge, improvements to the railroad crossing on Chestnut Street, road paving including Elm St, Dogwood, Colonial, E. Allendale, the intersection of Myrtle/West Crescent and the Grandstand parking lot.

We are also making significant improvement to the commuter lot. There is a new "P" sign for parking and another sign displaying the lot hours. This will encourage overflow parking from downtown and is a continuation of our beautification efforts.

Another fun project going on downtown is the Allendale Mural. The bas relief, mosaic panels of some of our treasured historic places in Allendale are already up. The painting portion to connect them all will commence in the upcoming weeks in time for a ribbon cutting on **Allendale Festival Day - September 20th!** This has been a tremendous collaboration between the building owner, land owner, Allendale organizations, students, administrators and art teachers. The Borough plans to install a pocket park in front of the mural for people to sit and hang out and enjoy the art created by Allendale students under the supervision of Allendale sculptor Simon Rigg. Stay tuned for details about the design contest in the works...

September 11th is a special and sacred day in Allendale; our ceremony is always on **September 11th at 7 pm**. We have a speaker come every year to share their story on that day, so we never forget. We are always looking for speakers so if you have a story to tell, please contact me.

The ARC 5K is back! Save the date...October 19th. This is a run that I started almost 15 years ago when I served on the board of Allendale Recreation. This year the run is in memory of Sharon Moran, long time Allendale resident who volunteered countless hours in many organizations around town. We have the opportunity to have \$25,000 matched dollar for dollar by the McKinley foundation. Please consider donating or becoming a sponsor. All proceeds will go right back into Allendale to some of our beloved organizations!

One of our pillars of success for the Borough is to drive innovation. We are happy to announce that our building department will soon offer online appointment and payments via GovPilot. We continue to strive to utilize an enterprise system to streamline our systems and processes to make transactions easier and more convenient for residents.

The next **Coffee with the Mayor** is scheduled for **Saturday, September 6th** from 9-11 at MORNING BLOOM. Come hang out with me and some council members in a beautiful, casual setting and ask any and as many questions as you want!

The community education series at the Allendale community center have been very successful. Stay tuned for more to come in this fall. • Household kitchen, office & bathroom trash





BULKY TRASH

- Furniture
- Carpeting
- Non-metal items
- Windows/mirrors/pane glass must be taped with an "X"

METAL

• Anything that is at least 75% metal, inluding artifical Christmas trees.

RECYCLING

Container One:

- Newspapers & inserts
- Junk mail, envelopes, office, notebook, construction paper
- Smooth and corrugated cardboard
- · Glossy magazines and catalogs
- Soft-covered books and telphone books
- Non-metallic wrapping paper & greeting cards
- Shredded paper
- Brown Grocery bags

Container Two:

- Food & beverage containers
- Plastic containers with a recycling code 1, 2, 5 & 7
- Aluminum cans, foil
- Aseptic packaging (ex. soup, milk containers)
- Metal cans & empty aerosol cans
- Green, clear & brown glass bottles and jars

**Please note that there are 2 separate trucks that pick up recyclables.

NEWS FROM The Allendale Green Team

The Green Team is seeking residents who are interested in a pilot program to separate food waste from your trash for curbside collection by a composting company. Neighboring municipalities that have established these programs calculated that food waste can comprise nearly 50% of the weight of regular household trash. Keeping food waste from landfills reduces methane, reduces the municipal trash budget and most importantly it feeds the earth by returning nutrients to the soil in the most natural way, composting. New Jersey's E-Bike & E-Scooter Law

E-bikes can be an exciting and fun way for kids and teens to get around—offering freedom, speed, and a taste of independence. But with that freedom comes a big responsibility: safety.



E-bikes are faster and heavier than regular bikes, which means the risks are greater too. That's why it's so important for young riders to know the rules and follow them every time they ride.

E-mobility devices make it easier to:

- Save on gas, parking, and rideshare costs.
- Access destinations without needing to walk or drive.
- Reduce carbon emissions.
- Make "first-mile" and "last-mile" connections for bus and train trips.
- Climb hills and keep up with traffic without getting sweaty.
- Help people with limitations due to age, physical fitness levels, or disabilities.

Low-speed e-bikes and e-scooters are regulated like bicycles. Drivers of low-speed e-bikes and e-scooters:

- Must ride in the same direction as traffic and obey all traffic lights, signs, and signals.
- Are advised to wear helmets to minimize potential head injury.
 Helmets are required in NJ for youth under age 17.
- Must park devices without blocking pedestrian and/or wheelchair access
- Should not ride on sidewalks. Off-road trails generally do not allow motorized bicycles, but may allow e-bikes and e-scooters.
 Regulations vary by municipality and county. Check all local ordinances and policies. Ride slowly in areas with pedestrians.

^{*} Restrictions may vary by agency. PATH and NJT restrict non-collapsible vehicles during peak travel times. Bus racks have limited availability and may not fit all bikes.


