Happy Fall everyone! I hope the transition back to school went smoothly. It's amazing how quickly the air has cooled and the leaves are starting to turn shades of red and gold.

Fall sports have started and the Borough is collaborating with Allendale Rec to prioritize field rehabilitation.

We hope to see everyone out on **Allendale Festival Day**, which is **Saturday**, **September 20**<sup>th</sup> from 12 - 4. In addition to the vendors, food and live music, there will be a ribbon cutting in front of the mural at 12pm. All the kids who participated in the mural have been invited. There will be lots of vendors, music and food throughout the day! Thank you to Allendale Chamber for organizing - please consider joining our Chamber. We are always looking for new businesses and volunteers.

The Mayor & Council are hosting our **3rd Town Hall on October 7th** at the community center. The main topic will be Fair Share Housing. This is a topic we have been dealing for years! The status is constantly changing and we will inform you about where we are in the process at this point.

**Save the date for the ARC 5K: October 19th**. This year the run is in memory of Sharon Moran, long time Allendale resident who volunteered countless hours in many organizations around town. We have the opportunity to have \$25,000 matched dollar for dollar by the McKinley foundation. Please consider donating or becoming a sponsor. All proceeds will go right back into Allendale to some of our beloved organizations!

The community center has been open almost 1 year. We have had great feedback and success. It was a much-needed facility for residents and we are thrilled to see it used so much. I'm very proud of our staff and volunteers for their efforts to kick this off and manage all the different schedules as well as bring in new programs to our residents. We will be hosting another **OPEN HOUSE on October 24th from 3-7**. All are welcome to stop in, ask questions and have a look around. Please check the website for new open gym & pickle ball schedules as well as other important dates.

We are starting to draw up specs for new outdoor tennis/pickle and basketball courts. These will be mostly funded using Bergen County grants. It appears we will need a total overhaul of the area which will require a full engineer analysis- we will keep everyone updated as we move forward with this next big capital project.

Recently our police department launched a comprehensive **Traffic Enforcement and Safety Initiative**. This is a multi-pronged approach with many components aimed at increasing safety in our town. Please read the statement from Chief Dillon in this newsletter. Please remain vigilant when driving and walking and please teach your kids to be responsible bike riders!

Dear Allendale Community,

As we welcome the start of a new school year, the safety of our students, pedestrians, and all roadway users remains a concern. The Allendale Police Department is launching a comprehensive Traffic Enforcement and Safety Initiative aimed at creating a safer environment around our schools and throughout the community.

Key components of this initiative include:

- Infrastructure Improvements: Replacement of faded traffic signs and renewal of roadway striping to enhance visibility and driver awareness.
- Data-Driven Enforcement: Utilizing data collected from existing and newly installed electronic speed signs to prioritize enforcement efforts accordingly.
- Radar Trailers: Deployment of "Your Speed Is" radar trailers in school zones and other critical areas to provide realtime feedback to drivers and encourage voluntary speed compliance.
- Visibility Enhancements: Trimming of tree limbs and vegetation that obstruct traffic signs to ensure all signage is clearly visible to drivers.
- Targeted Traffic Enforcement: Increased patrols and specialized task forces focused on addressing:
  - Speeding
  - o Failure to yield to pedestrian violations
  - Distracted driving
  - E-bike violations
- Advanced Speed Detection Tools: Use of handheld laser and radar speed measuring devices to support precise and effective speed enforcement operations.
- Automated Parking Enforcement: Installation of parking enforcement cameras to address illegal parking in crosswalks downtown causing an unsafe condition for pedestrians.
- Commercial Vehicle Enforcement: In partnership with the Bergen County Sheriff's Office, we will be conducting commercial truck enforcement to ensure compliance with safety regulations and NJ state laws.
- Pedestrian Safety Education: Continued implementation of the Cross with Care program, aimed at educating pedestrians, especially children, on safe crossing habits and traffic awareness.

We encourage all residents to remain vigilant, drive responsibly, and help us make this school year a safe one for everyone. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation.

#### BIKE HELMETS CAN HELP PREVENT SERIOUS BRAIN INJURIES

In New Jersey, Children under 17 are required to wear helmets for both bikes and e-bikes. However, wearing a helmet at any age is a wise decision as cycle helmets offer vital protection to one's fragile skull and has been shown to reduce the risk of head injury by up to 70%. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, more children ages 5-14 go to emergency rooms for bicycle-related injuries than any other sport; many are head injuries.

Like car crashes, bicycle crashes can happen at any time, involving not only children, but adults, many of whom are skilled riders. In fact, middle-aged adults represent the average age of bicycle riders killed and injured.

Helmets are the single most effective piece of safety equipment for riders of all ages, if you crash. Everyone should choose to wear a helmet; it just makes sense!


