- · Magazines, catalogs, phone books, soft covered books

#### ITEMS NOT ACCEPTABLE

- Paper soled with grease, paint, etc.
- · Wax coated paper
- Hard covered books (if the covers are removed, then acceptable to recycle)

#### WHAT IS COMMINGLE RECYCLING?

- Plastic containers with a recycling code 1-7
- · Aluminum cans, foil
- · Metal cans and empty aerosol cans
- · Green, clear and brown glass bottles and jars
- Aseptic packaging (ex: soup, milk containers)
   All food containers should be rinsed and cleaned of debris prior to disposal.

#### ITEMS NOT ACCEPTABLE

- · Ceramic plates and cups
- All Styrofoam
- · Window glass and table tops
- · Cookware pots, pans, bowls, utensils
- · Plastic bags, plastic wrap and plastic film
- Toothpaste
- Wire hangers (this is scrap metal or should be returned to drycleaner)

#### GARBAGE COLLECTION

Suburban Disposal, under a contract with the municipality, performs curbside household garbage collection for both the EAST and WEST side of the Borough. The NJ Transit Railroad divides the Borough. No receptacles shall be set out prior to 6:00pm on the night before collection and shall be removed by 9:00pm on the day of collection. Please use containers no larger than 30 gallons. Please refrain from calling if your garbage is not collected by its "normal" time. A number of things,

including weather, truck break downs, detours, etc.
may occur that could detain the contractor from
collecting the route. The contractor has until
6:00pm to finish the route.

#### WEST SIDE

Mondays (place at curb before 7:00am) 2nd collection starts the week of May 23, and ends on the first week of September. Collection will be done Monday and Thursday.

Bulky Trash collection 2nd Wednesday of the month, place at curb before 7:00am

#### **EAST SIDE**

#### Garbage Collection:

Tuesdays (place at curb before 7:00am) 2nd collection starts the week of May 23, and ends on the first week of September. Collection will be done Tuesday and Friday.

Ist Wednesday of the month, place at curb before 7:00am

#### MOVING?

Gently used items can be donated. Visit the Borough website at www.allendalenj.gov for a listing of charities that accept these items. One month prior to closing, call 201 818-4410 to schedule a pick-up and we'll notify the contractor. This collection will coincide with your regular garbage collection. Items that are recyclable will not be

collected. Please bring them to the Recycling Center. This is a **one-time** only collection, please schedule accordingly. There is a five piece limit on furniture.

All grass, leaves and brush are accepted with a resident compost permit. Permits can be purchased at Borough Hall, Monday – Friday 9am – 4:30pm. Call 201-818-4400 ext 200 for more information. No plastic bags allowed, please use brown biodegradable bags or place in container to transport grass and leaves.

NO LANDSCAPERS OR CONTRACTORS are allowed.

#### CUT-IT-AND-LEAVE-IT

Recycling your own grass is easy and saves you, and the town, money. Use a mulching lawnmower or replace the blade with a mulching blade. When you cut your grass, allow it to remain on the ground to be reabsorbed and provide vital nutrients to your grass. You save time by not having to bag the grass and transport it to the Compost Site. You won't have to use as much fertilizer and the cut grass helps reduce water evaporation so you use less water.

#### SCRAP METAL COLLECTION

The fourth (4th) Wednesday of the month for BOTH sides of the Borough.

Items acceptable for curbside metal collection are:

- Bicycles
- Refrigerators\* remove the doors
- · Washers and dryers
- · Cast iron
- Radiators
- · BBQ grills minus the propane tank
- · Anything that is at least 75% metal.

\*appliances such as refrigerators, air conditioners, etc., containing "Freon or CDC's" must be certified that the Freon and CDC's have been removed by a certified person or vendor and that a sticker (supplied by the removal company) is attached to the appliance. This is required by law!

# MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

with the cold weather upon us, and the beginning of the heating season, don't forget to change the batteries in your Smoke and Carbon Monoxide detectors to keep your family safe! A working detector greatly increases your chances of surviving a fire in your home or detecting a carbon monoxide leak. Here are some other important tips to consider:

- Dust or vacuum your smoke/CO detectors when changing the batteries.
- Test alarms once a month using the test button.
- Replace the entire alarm if it's more than 7 years old, or doesn't work properly when tested.
- Install smoke and CO alarms on every level of your home, including the basement, kitchen area, and outside of bedrooms.
- Make sure everyone in your home understands what the warning sounds of the alarms are.
- Develop an escape plan that includes where everyone will meet outside and what to bring in case of an emergency.
- If an alarm sounds, dial 911 immediately.
   I would like to thank you in advance for your cooperation. With these simple and easy tips, the Borough of Allendale will remain a safe place to live.

# ALLENDALE POLICE UPDATE

Allendale Police would like to remind residents about ordinance 252-81, which requires vehicles to be moved off the roadway when snow accumulations require plowing/removal. Specifically, it states "Whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that plowing and/or snow removal will be required by the Borough, an emergency is deemed to exist and no vehicles shall be parked on any street or highway within the Borough. Such parking prohibition shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased until the streets have been plowed sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic." Our DPW cannot properly clear the roads when cars are left on the street.
