GARBAGE COLLECTION

Suburban Disposal, under a contract with the municipality, performs curbside household garbage collection for both the EAST and WEST side of the Borough. The NJ Transit Railroad divides the Borough. No receptacles shall be set out prior to 6:00pm on the night before collection and shall be removed by 9:00pm on the day of collection. **Please use containers no larger than 30 gallons.** Please refrain from calling if your garbage is not collected by its "normal" time. A number of things, including weather, truck break downs, detours, etc. may occur that could delay the contractor from collecting the route. The contractor has until 6:00pm to finish the route.

West Side

Garbage Collection:

Mondays (place at curb before 6:00am)

2nd collection starts the week of May 18, through the week of September 7. Collection will be done Mondays & Thursdays.

Bulky Trash Collection:

2nd Wednesday of the month (place at curb before 6:00am)

East Side

Garbage Collection:

Tuesdays (place at curb before 6:00am)

2nd collection starts the week of May 18, through the week of September 7. Collection will be done Tuesdays & Fridays.

Bulky Trash Collection:

1st Wednesday of the month (place at curb before 6:00am)

Accepted Bulky Trash items are:

- Furniture • Carpeting • Non-metal items
- Window/mirrors/pane glass must be taped with an "X"

TVs and other electronics cannot be picked up with garbage collection. Check www.bcua.org for the dates of their electronics recycling programs.

Styrofoam items should be put out with regular garbage collection.



RECYCLING COLLECTION

CONTAINERS FOR ALL HOUSEHOLD PAPER

What does this include?

- Newspaper & inserts
- Cardboard boxes/press board
- Cereal, pasta, tissue boxes, toilet paper roll, paper towel roll
- Junk mail, envelopes, office paper, construction paper
- Brown paper bags
- Magazines, catalogs, phone books, soft covered books
- Shredded paper
- Empty and unsoiled pizza boxes
- Non-metallic wrapping paper and greeting cards

Please use collection containers no larger than 30 gallons.

Items not acceptable

- Paper soiled with grease, paint, etc.
- Wax coated paper
- Hard covered books (acceptable if the covers are removed)

CONTAINERS FOR COMMINGLE

What is commingle recycling?

- Plastic containers with a recycling code 1, 2, 5, 7
- Aluminum cans, foil, metal cans and empty aerosol cans
- Green, clear and brown glass bottles and jars
- Aseptic packaging (ex: soup, milk containers)

Rinse and clean all food containers prior to disposal

Items not acceptable

- Ceramic plates and cups
- All Styrofoam
- Window glass and table tops
- Cookware – pots, pans, bowls, utensils
- Plastic bags, plastic wrap & plastic film (return to grocery store)
- Toothpaste tubes
- Wire hangers (put out with scrap metal or return to drycleaner)

RECYCLING TIPS

- When recycling bottles, leave the caps on the bottles
- Leave plastic spouts on cardboard juice containers
- Recycle your clean and dry plastic bags and film packaging materials at your local grocery stores (Please remove receipts from bags)

Suburban picks up on some dates that the Borough is closed.

What CAN be dropped off?

Items that make money for the town.

- Commingled recyclables – loose, not in plastic bags
- Cardboard – place in garbage truck
- Junk mail, magazines, newspapers – loose, not in plastic bags or tied
- Soft covered books, remove hard covers
- Office paper, shredded paper – loose, not in plastic bags or tied
- Clothing/textiles – sheets, blankets, table cloths

What CANNOT be dropped off?

- Household garbage
- Bulky trash
- Scrap metal
- Tires
- Automobile batteries
- Hazardous waste
- Plastic bags, plastic film, plastic wrapping
- Electronic waste such as TVs or computers

MOVING?

One month prior to closing, call 201-818-4410 or email publicworks@allendalenj.gov to schedule a pick-up and we'll notify the contractor. This collection will coincide with your regular garbage collection. Items that are recyclable will not be collected. Please bring them to the Recycling Center or a special BCUA recycling event.

Items that are mostly metal will be picked up on metal collection day only. This is a one-time only collection, please schedule accordingly. There is a five piece limit on furniture.

All grass, leaves and brush are accepted with a resident compost permit. Permits can be purchased starting March 15th at Borough Hall, Monday – Friday 9am – 4:00pm. Call 201-818-4400 ext 200 for more information.

No plastic bags allowed, please use brown biodegradable bags or place in container to transport grass and leaves for residents only. NO LANDSCAPERS, CONTRACTORS OR BUSINESSES are allowed.

CUT-IT-AND-LEAVE-IT

Recycling your own grass is easy and saves you, and the town, money. Use a mulching lawnmower or replace the blade with a mulching blade. When you cut your grass, allow it to remain on the ground to be reabsorbed and provide vital nutrients to your grass. You save time by not having to bag the grass and transport it to the Compost Site. You won't have to use as much fertilizer and the cut grass helps reduce water evaporation so you use less water.

SCRAP METAL COLLECTION

The fourth (4th) Wednesday of the month for BOTH sides of the Borough. Items acceptable for curbside metal collection are:

- Anything that is at least 75% metal
- Bicycles
- Refrigerators* (remove the doors)
- Washers and dryers
- Cast iron
- Radiators
- BBQ grills – minus the propane tank
- Humidifiers
- Microwaves

*Appliances such as refrigerators, air conditioners, etc., containing "Freon or CDC's" must be certified that the Freon and CDC's have been removed by a certified person or vendor and a sticker (supplied by the removal company) must be attached to the appliance. This is required by law!



The Borough of Allendale continues to strongly encourage all residents to focus on using reusable shopping bags and drinking cups.

SNOW REMOVAL

 - Snow must be cleared from fire hydrants (minimum of 3ft radius) within 24 hours of daylight after snowfall. (Ord. 15-08)
 - Snow and ice must not be deposited on streets. (Ord.233-28)
- ***Place curbside collection where it will not interfere with plows and can be seen and collected safely.***

ALLENDALE POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS

SNOW EMERGENCY PARKING

There is no parking on ANY street when it snows. The ordinance 252-81 prohibits parking on public streets during a snow event as well as parking a vehicle so that it extends into the roadway when it snows. The parking prohibition remains in effect until after the snowfall has stopped and until the entire block of roadway has been cleared of snow.

HOUSE NUMBERING

We are seeing that many homes do not have posted or have not replaced proper numbers on the home or business and is making it more difficult for first responders and delivery companies to find the correct location because lack of numbers.

COMMUNITY CAMERA PARTNERSHIP

The Allendale PD is asking residents and businesses to voluntarily register their privately owned surveillance camera systems. By doing so, we may be able to use the information to assist in the apprehension

OPERATION REASSURANCE

Operation Reassurance is a program administered by the Allendale Police Department, where a participant living alone calls our communications center each day. If we do not receive a call, an officer is sent to the person's home to check on them and assure they are safe. The intention of Operation Reassurance is to make sure that people living alone will have personal contact each day with someone to make sure all is well.

An Update from the Allendale Board of Health November 2019

Information on use of e-cigarettes and vaping:

- The CDC has identified vitamin E acetate as a chemical of concern among people with e-cigarette or vaping product use associated lung injury.
- Vitamin E acetate is used as an additive, most notably as a thickening agent in THC-containing e-cigarette or vaping products.
- THC use has been associated with a wide range of health effects, particularly with prolonged frequent use. The best way to avoid potentially harmful effects is to not use THC-containing e-cigarette or vaping products.

The Opioid Crisis, a Public Health Emergency:

- At least 3,163 people died of drug overdoses in NJ in 2018.
- According to the 2014 *Treatment Episode Data Set*, New Jersey was 4th in the nation for primary heroin hospital admissions for ages greater than 12.

How are we addressing this crisis?

- Federally, the FDA approved nasal naloxone in 2015. It is available at local pharmacies and is carried by law enforcement and EMS.
- In New Jersey, Reach NJ, was established as a 24/7 hotline for persons looking for help with drug addiction. They can be contacted at 1-844-732-2465.
- NJ has instituted a 5 day prescribing limit on all opioid drugs.
- Other programs such as Project Medicine Drop (lobby of Allendale PD), Recovery High Schools, and a Recovery Coach Program have been implemented in NJ.

TIPS TO STAY SAFE WHEN A WINTER STORM THREATENS

Prepare NOW

- Prepare your home to keep out the cold with insulation, caulking, and weather stripping. Learn how to keep pipes from freezing. Install and test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors with battery backups.
- Pay attention to weather reports and warnings of freezing weather and winter storms. Sign up for Allendale's Swiftreach 911 for emergency notifications.
- Gather supplies in case you need to stay home for several days without power. Keep in mind each person's specific needs, including medication. Do not forget the needs of pets. Have extra batteries for radios and flashlights.
- Create an emergency supply kit for your car. Include jumper cables, sand, a flashlight, warm clothes, blankets, bottled water, and non-perishable snacks. Keep the gas tank and windshield wiper reservoir full.
