Last week, the Borough concluded its annual paving program, with improvements made to High St., Heights Rd., Cambridge Dr., and Pearl Ct. I want to thank our staff and professionals for making this project a priority every year. A lot of coordination and preparation goes into this project and I want to thank the residents for their patience. Bergen County has recently notified us that the paving of Hillside Ave. will commence on or about October 6th. We are also very excited that work has begun on the Downtown Streetscape project. This work is being funded by grants that the Borough received over the course of several years from the NJDOT. Updates will include new sidewalks, replacement of overgrown trees, new decorative lighting, and other streetscape improvements.

This year's General Election is very different than what we are all used to. The Borough Clerk's Office has been working diligently to sort through the information coming in from the County and the Governor's offices in order to provide Allendale residents with the most accurate information for this year's election. 

THE YEARLY HYDRANT FLUSHING PROGRAM IS SCHEDULED TO START ON OCTOBER 5, 2020

Suez Water will be conducting hydrant testing and flushing throughout town over the next few weeks. Flushing will occur during the hours of 8:00 am through 3:00 pm. We request that customers use **minimal** water during the flushing in their area to avoid the possibility of drawing sediments into the household plumbing. We regret any inconvenience the flushing program may cause you. If you have any questions or would like more information please contact Suez Water at 855-367-6708

Please note that these dates are tentative and subject to change.

To cleanse the system, Suez Water systematically open our fire hydrants to increase water flows – allowing us to “flush” any minerals and deposits from the pipes. While flushing the system won’t interrupt your water service, when crews are working in your area, you may notice a temporary drop in water pressure or discolored water. This is discoloration is normal. If you are experiencing any discolored water simply let your water run until it is clear.

Customer Tips:

- Avoid running your tap water and using the washing machine or dishwasher while crews are flushing in your area.
- If discolored water occurs, simply run the cold water for a few minutes until it clear. This will allow the sediment to work its way through your pipes.
- Check for discolored water before using the washing machine or dishwasher. Wait until the water runs clear at the tap before doing laundry or running the dishwasher. NOTE: If your laundry becomes stained, DO NOT PUT YOUR LAUNDRY IN THE DRYER. Rewash clothes immediately using detergent and add a rust remover. Most rust removers can also be used on stained fixtures.

In some cases, slight discoloration might linger for a few hours. This discoloration only affects the appearance of the water and does not affect water quality. No health hazards are associated with discolored water from hydrant flushing.

If water pressure or water volume seems low after flushing has been completed, check your faucet screens for trapped particles.

ALLENDALE 2020 DOWNTOWN STREETScape IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

OVERVIEW:

The Allendale 2020 Downtown Streetscape Improvement Project consists of **replacing the existing pavers, Belgian Block curb, and constructing ADA compliant curb ramps** along West Allendale Avenue.

Additional improvements consist of upgraded **decorative street lighting, the installation of large deciduous trees, and trash receptacles along West Allendale Avenue**. Other improvements include the resetting of existing street scape features, including but not limited to benches, planters, high visibility crosswalks, and signs. All of these improvements are funded by NJDOT Municipal Aid.

The project is scheduled in 3 Phases with a timeline of completion within sixty calendar days after notice to proceed, weather permitting.

WHY WE ARE DOING THIS:

The last street scape update to our downtown was in 2004 with some elements dating back to the early 1990s. Over time it has been determined that the current lighting was aging and needed upgrading. The pavers were showing their wear and tear and were uneven in many areas. They could not be washed or replaced. All of the street trees were outgrowing their space. Additionally, the lifespan of the street trees is 10 - 15 years.

FUNDING:

In planning this renewal, Allendale applied for and received three Department of Transportation (DOT) grants **totaling \$662,000 to complete the Allendale Downtown Streetscape Project!** These DOT grants are designed exclusively for use in downtown upgrades **and can not be used for anything else.** Grant opportunities have a limited period for application, awarding, and use. **These deadlines dictate the timing of the project.** By not applying, Allendale would have lost our opportunity to refresh our downtown and the grants would have been awarded to another town's project. Funding for these grants is not necessarily available every year.

GOALS:

Downtown districts like we have in Allendale are the heart of a town. They are places we go to meet with family and friends, dine out, shop at the fine boutiques and storefronts. Maintaining, enhancing, and keeping the public safety of our downtown district is crucial for the long term viability of this Borough.

To that end:

- Allendale was awarded three Department of Transportation **grants totaling \$662,000** for the Allendale Downtown Streetscape Project.
- The update and installation of modern lights will be more efficient and will save on energy and money
- A well-lit downtown also plays into our primary goal of public safety, well-lit areas will make people feel safe while strolling the sidewalk and crossing the streets
- Improved signage and high visibility crosswalks will also play a major role in improving pedestrian safety.
- The plan also calls on replacing all the trees with large deciduous trees, including several areas where trees were removed due to disease. The results will be **more trees downtown.**

The Allendale Downtown Streetscape Project will ensure our beautiful downtown remains a crown jewel in our Allendale community.

Tuesday, November 3rd is Election Day. All active registered voters will automatically be receiving a VOTE-BY-MAIL ballot in the mail. You **DO NOT** have to send a request for a ballot.

✓ *Voting using the VOTE-BY-MAIL ballot:*

OPTION # 1:

MAIL your completed ballot through the USPS in the first-class postage-paid envelope provided. Ballots postmarked by November 3rd and received by the Board of Elections before November 10th at 8 PM will be counted. Please see our "How to fill out the VOTE-BY-MAIL Ballot" on page 2, OR

OPTION # 2:

DROP your completed ballot at one of the 18 **SECURE** Ballot Drop Boxes, located throughout Bergen County, by 8 PM on November 3rd (see list on page 3). Only drop a **BERGEN COUNTY** ballot at a **BERGEN COUNTY** Drop Box! These boxes are monitored 24 hours a day and ballots are picked up by representatives from both parties (Democrat & Republican) along with a Sheriff's Officer, OR

OPTION # 3:

BRING your completed ballot to your polling location (see below) on November 3rd between 6 AM and 8 PM. You can only **BRING YOUR OWN** ballot and you will be required to stand in line to sign the Voter Book when delivering.

... that the 18 secure Ballot Drop Boxes are under 24 hour surveillance and ballots are picked up by representatives from both parties (Democrat & Republican) along with a Sheriff Officer.

... if you need your ballot sent to an alternate address (ex: college student), you must complete a VOTE-BY-MAIL application ([Click Here](#)). Put your Allendale address in Section 3 and temporary address in Section 4. Postage is required.

... if your signature has changed significantly, update it by checking off the "Signature Update" in Box 1 of the Voter Registration Form ([Click Here](#)). If you voted in the Primary and were not notified, your signature is OK!

... if you make a mistake on or misplace your ballot call the County Clerk's Office at (201)336-7020 for a duplicate ballot.

... if your ballot is rejected by the Bergen County Board of Elections, you will receive a Cure Letter within 48 hours of Election Day.
