**RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE
AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN AGREEMENT OF SALE BETWEEN THE
BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE AND SUEZ WATER NEW JERSEY, INC. FOR THE
SALE OF THE BOROUGH'S WATER SYSTEM**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Allendale, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough") currently owns and operates a water system servicing the residents and property owners (the "Customers") within the geographic boundaries of the Borough (the "System"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that it is in the best interest of such Customers to sell the System to an entity with experience and expertise in owning and operating such systems in order to meet all necessary demands associated with such System including all present and future requirements of various state and federal regulatory agencies and to make necessary capital improvements to the System; and

WHEREAS, the Borough prepared and distributed a Request for Bids for the Sale of the Water System (the "RFB") dated April 7, 2021 requesting bids for the purchase of the System pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:62-1 et seq. (the "Public Utilities Law"); and

WHEREAS, on May 24, 2021 the Borough received two bids from two regulated water companies, Suez Water New Jersey Inc. and New Jersey American Water Company, Inc., to purchase the Borough's System; and

WHEREAS, based on the review of the above referenced bids, the Borough has determined that the bid submitted by Suez Water New Jersey Inc. in the amount of \$18,000,000 was the highest responsible bid; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the RFB, the Borough would sell all of the Borough's rights and interests in the land and improvements comprising the System, provided that any purchaser of the System would continue to provide water production, storage treatment and distribution services to the Customers in accordance with all applicable state and local standards, make all capital improvements as required by the RFB, and meet other requirements set forth in the RFB; and

WHEREAS, the Borough and Suez Water New Jersey Inc. have agreed to the terms of the sale of the System; and

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WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 21-10, the Mayor and Council approved the Agreement of Sale and authorized a referendum question to be placed on the November 2, 2021 ballot requesting that the voters of the Borough decide whether or not to sell the System; and

WHEREAS, on November 2, 2021, the voters of the Borough voted in favor of the sale of the System to Suez Water New Jersey Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to enter into the Agreement of Sale a copy of is incorporated by reference herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Agreement of Sale in a form substantially similar to the form incorporated by reference herein.
2. That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute all other ancillary documents and take all other actions necessary to effectuate the intent and purpose of this Resolution; and
3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE THROUGH
THE ALLENDALE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE DEFENSE
LOGISTICS AGENCY, LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT OFFICE, 1033 PROGRAM
TO ENABLE THE ALLENDALE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO REQUEST AND
ACQUIRE EXCESS DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE EQUIPMENT**

WHEREAS, the United States Congress authorized the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) 1033 Program to make use of excess Department of Defense personal property by making that personal property available to municipal, county and State law enforcement agencies (LEAS); and

WHEREAS, DLA rules mandate that all equipment acquired through the 1033 Program remain under the control of the requesting LEA; and

WHEREAS, participation in the 1033 Program allows municipal and county LEAS to obtain property they might not otherwise be able to afford in order to enhance community preparedness, response, and resiliency; and

WHEREAS, although property is provided through the 1033 Program at no cost to municipal and county LEAs, these entities are responsible for the costs associated with delivery, maintenance, fueling, and upkeep of the property, and for specialized training on the operation of any acquired property; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-30.2 requires that the governing body of the municipality or county approve, by a majority of the full membership, both enrollment in, and the acquisition of any property through, the 1033 Program.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Allendale, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that the Allendale Police Department is hereby authorized to enroll in the 1033 Program for no more than a one-year period, with authorization to participate terminating on December 31 of the current calendar year; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Allendale Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire items of non-controlled property designated "DEMIL A," which may include: automobiles (sedan and wagon), carriers (ambulance, cargo

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and command post), security vehicles, thermal sights, trucks (ambulance, cargo, carryall, command reconnaissance, dump, maintenance, materials handling-container hoisting, panel, stake, utility, van, and wrecker), trucks and truck tractors (Demil C) and off road utility vehicles and any other supplies or equipment of a non-military nature identified by the LEA, if it shall become available in the period of time for which this resolution authorizes, based on the needs of the Allendale Police Department, without restriction; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Allendale Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire the following "DEMIL B through D" property, if it shall become available in the period of time for which this resolution authorizes; and

BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED that the "DEMIL B through D" controlled 3-page property list in its entirety is hereby approved and hereto attached to this resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Allendale Police Department shall develop and implement a full training plan and policy for the maintenance and use of the acquired property; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Allendale Police Department shall provide a quarterly accounting of all property obtained through the 1033 Program which shall be available to the public upon request; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect immediately and shall be valid to authorize requests to acquire "DEMIL A" property and "DEMIL B through D" property that may be made available through the 1033 Program during the period of time for which this resolution authorizes; with Program participation and all property request authorization terminating on December 31st of the current calendar year from January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022.



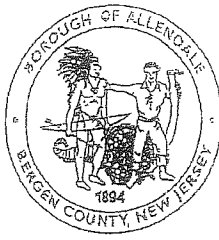
