AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF A 2022 BERGEN COUNTY OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND MUNICIPAL PARK IMPROVEMENT GRANT APPLICATION

WHEREAS, the Bergen County Open Space, Recreation, Floodplain Protection, Farmland & Historic Preservation Trust Fund ("County Trust Fund"), provides matching grants to municipal governments and to nonprofit organizations for assistance in the development or redevelopment of outdoor municipal recreation facilities; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of Allendale desires to further the public interest by obtaining a matching grant of \$75,000.00 from the County Trust Fund for shade structures, tables and playground improvements at Crestwood Lake; and,

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, COVENANTING TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED, APPLICABLE TO THE EXCLUSION FROM GROSS INCOME FOR FEDERAL INCOME TAX PURPOSES OF INTEREST ON OBLIGATIONS ISSUED BY THE BOROUGH OF ALLENDALE AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, ACTING BOROUGH CLERK, CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER AND OTHER BOROUGH OFFICIALS TO TAKE SUCH ACTION AS THEY MAY DEEM NECESSARY OR ADVISABLE TO EFFECT SUCH COMPLIANCE AND DESIGNATING A \$4,122,277 BOND ANTICIPATION NOTE, DATED APRIL 22, 2022, PAYABLE APRIL 21, 2023, AS A "QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATION" PURSUANT TO SECTION 265(b)(3) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Allendale, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough") from time to time issues bonds, notes and other obligations, the interest on which is excluded from gross income for Federal income tax purposes, and desires to take such action as may be necessary or advisable to establish and maintain such exclusion; and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), contains provisions with respect to the exclusion from gross income for Federal income tax purposes of interest on obligations, including provisions, among others, which require issuers of tax-exempt obligations, such as the Borough to account for and rebate certain arbitrage earnings to the United States Treasury and to take other action to establish and maintain such Federal tax exclusion; and

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WHEREAS, the Borough desires to designate a \$4,122,277 Bond Anticipation Note, dated

April 22, 2022, payable April 21, 2023 (the "Note"), as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation"

pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of

Allendale, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Borough Council hereby covenants on behalf of the Borough, to

the extent permitted by the Constitution and the laws of the State of New Jersey, to do and perform

all acts and things permitted by law and necessary to assure that interest paid on bonds, notes or

other obligations of the Borough (including the Note) be and remain excluded from gross income

of the owners thereof for Federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Code.

SECTION 2. The Mayor, Acting Borough Clerk, Chief Financial Officer and the

other officials of the Borough are hereby authorized and directed to take such action, make such

representations and give such assurances as they may deem necessary or advisable to effect

compliance with the Code.

SECTION 3. The Note is hereby designated as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation"

for the purpose of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

SECTION 4. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) said Note is not a "private

activity bond" as defined in the Code and (2) the Borough and its subordinate entities, if any, do

not reasonably anticipate issuing in excess of \$10 million of new money tax-exempt obligations

(other than private activity bonds) during the calendar year 2022.

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SECTION 5. It is further determined and stated that the Borough has not, as of the

date hereof, issued any tax-exempt obligations (other than the Note) during the calendar year 2022.

SECTION 6. The Borough will, to the best of its ability, attempt to comply with

respect to the limitations on issuance of tax-exempt obligations pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of

the Code; however, said Borough does not covenant to do so, and hereby expressly states that a

covenant is not made hereby.

SECTION 7. The issuing officers of the Borough are hereby authorized to deliver

a certified copy of this resolution to the original purchaser of the Note and to further provide such

original purchaser with a certificate of obligations issued during the calendar year 2022 dated as

of the date of delivery of the Note.

<u>SECTION 8</u>. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTION OF STATE OF NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION DIVISION OF WATER QUALITY TREATMENT WORKS APPROVAL PERMIT APPLICATION

WHEREAS, the Borough of Allendale ("Allendale") and the Borough of Saddle River ("Saddle River") are parties to a certain Sewer Connection Agreement dated July 7, 1997 (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, Saddle River has advised Allendale that due to the contemplated construction of additional residential dwelling units within Saddle River, Saddle River will need to increase the sewer flow from Saddle River to Allendale beyond that which is provided for in the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the additional development in Saddle River and its need for additional sewer flow capacity from Allendale, Saddle River has requested Allendale to consent to and execute a State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Division of Water Quality Treatment Works Approval Permit Application (the "Application"); and

WHEREAS, Allendale wishes to accommodate the request of Saddle River subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Resolution; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The Mayor, Acting Borough Clerk, Borough Engineer and Borough Attorney are authorized to take any and all appropriate steps to implement this Resolution, including execution of the Application, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Resolution.
- 2. The consent of Allendale and its execution of the Application are specifically conditioned on Saddle River conducting, at its sole expense, a sewer flow capacity study confirming that Allendale has sufficient sewer flow capacity to accommodate an additional 112 Saddle River residential development units. The results of such study shall be provided by Saddle River to Allendale and are subject to Allendale's acceptance and approval.
