WHEREAS, as a result of the change in the recent Federal tax laws applicable to the elimination of property tax payments as itemized deductions available to individuals filing personal tax returns beginning in 2018, a significant number of Borough property owners elected to prepay their 2018 property taxes for the 1st half and in some cases, the 2nd half with the anticipation that such payments will be allowable deductions on their 2017 personal tax returns, and, as a result of subsequent IRS guidance on the deductibility of such prepaid 2018 property taxes, there have been instances where taxpayers are seeking refunds of payments made toward the 2nd half of their 2018 property taxes.
