Council Committee Reports and Comments

This agenda item was addressed during the Work Session.

Mayor's Report: (continued)

Mayor Bernstein continued his Mayor's Report from the Work Session. He thanked Michelle Ryan, Deputy Clerk, for her work in organizing the Mayor for a Day activities.

With respect to AccuScan, he reported that plans and large format Building Department records are currently being scanned and will then be indexed. It anticipated that these files will be provided soon.

The first annual Junior Police Academy graduation is being held tomorrow. He commended Officer Azevedo and all involved as he expressed that it was a great experience for the participants. He advised that there was discussion regarding the possibility of the Fire Department doing a similar program.

Mayor Bernstein and Ron Kistner, Administrative Officer/Director of Operations, met with Kerry Pflugh, DEP Government Representative. Mayor Bernstein commented that it was a very informative meeting.

Councilwoman Wilczynski announced that she just received a video from the Holiday Observers to commemorate its centennial which she hopes to have posted to the Borough website.

Staff Reports:

Ray Wiss, Municipal Attorney, reported that he has been involved in contract review and personnel matters. He noted that the 220 and 230 West Crescent Avenue project is multifaceted and has required a lot of time for all involved.

Anne Dodd, Municipal Clerk, advised that she has received 23 OPRA requests since the last meeting and 296 OPRA requests to date this year.

Ron Kistner, Administrative Officer/Director of Operations, announced that hydro-raking of the upper pond will take place next week. Mulch will be placed at the Firehouse, Police Department, and 9/11 Memorial next week.

Public Comment on any issue:

Ben Peare, 477 Hillside Avenue, advised that he is attending tonight's meeting as part of the requirements to earn his Communications merit badge with the Boy Scouts. He stated that his current rank is 1st Class and he is working to attain the rank of Eagle.

James Thomas, 30 Arlton Avenue, expressed concern that the Land Use Board may be restricted from taking action which materially impacts the plans for 220 and 230 West Crescent Avenue if the financial agreement is finalized prior to an application being submitted. He further inquired whether the amount of the PILOT reflected in the Letter of Intent remains the same.

Borough Attorney Wiss explained that the financial impact of any modifications proposed by the Land Use Board would need to be controlled by the contract language just as any other contingency. He stated that the Land Use Board should carry out its duties irrespective of the financial agreement and advised that the bottom line of the PILOT agreement is still being negotiated.

Nick Gray, 50 Walnut Place, advised that he is attending tonight on behalf of an Eagle Scout applicant, Thomas Lucas, as the project mentor in order to confirm that they are permitted to proceed with the refurbishing of the shuffle board courts. He provided an overview of what would be involved with this project.

Councilwoman Wilczynski confirmed that the necessary paperwork has been signed and is ready to go.

Adjournment:

There being no further business to come before the Mayor and Council, on a motion by Councilwoman Homan, second by Councilwoman Wilczynski, and unanimously carried, to adjourn this meeting. The meeting was adjourned at 8:22 p.m.
