

- All items should be put out *starting at 6pm the night before* the scheduled collection. •
- Wood pallets are not collected by our garbage contractor. You must make your own arrangements to dispose of them.
- You must schedule a one-time, courtesy move-out pickup with TatianaMarquis@AllendaleNJ.gov • at least 3 WEEKS in advance. No metal, electronics, or recyclable materials collected.
- Remember to make sure that the lids are securely on top of your cans, especially garbage. This will help keep wildlife at bay.
- Collection containers can be no larger than 30 gallons.
- Bulk Trash must be placed on the curb and **not placed** in the road.
- Food containers being recycled need • to be rinsed and cleaned before you dispose.
- Soiled pizza boxes are garbage and NOT recyclable.

## MOBILE PAPER SHREDDING

#### Give your paper a safe retirement – shred it!

Recycle your confidential documents such as, bills, receipts, tax returns, medical records, legal documents, etc. safely by shredding them. (Recycle magazines and non-confidential paper at curbside.)

#### In an effort to accommodate everyone, there is a limit of four (4) bags/boxes, weighing no more than 10 lbs. each.

Paper clips and staples are acceptable. Please remove binder clips.

Shredding performed immediately on-site.

\*\*\*Shredding program will end prior to 2pm in the event the shredding trucks reach capacity.

### ELECTRONICS & COMPUTERS

#### Recycle one "byte" at a time – bring us your electronics and computers!

Recycle laptops, monitors, cables, wires, speakers, computers, televisions, stereos, printers, and more!



#### Give your tires one last spin – recycle them!

Four (4) tire limit, per delivery. Tires with or without rims accepted.





Discard your unwanted and expired overthe-counter and prescription medications in a secured Project Medicine Drop box.

Bring medication in original containers or a sealed bag. Sharps and liquids will not be accepted.

You can also dispose of unused and expired medications anonymously, seven days a week, 365 days a year, at "prescription drug drop boxes" located within the headquarters of participating police departments. #### From the North Aris Designed

#### From the North (via Route 17)

Turn right off Route 17 South onto Ridgewood Avenue (West) to Paramus Road. Turn left onto Paramus Road and continue approximately two miles to college; proceed around jug handle to main entrance.

#### From the East

Take Route 4 West to Paramus Road (Paramus Road is ¾ miles past Route 17 intersection.) Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north approximately two miles to Bergen Community College entrance on right.

#### From the South (via Route 17)

Take Route 17 North to Century Road exit, second exit to the right, proceed around cloverleaf over Route 17 onto Century Road (West). Continue to Paramus Road and turn right onto Paramus Road to college entrance on right.

#### From the West

Take Route 4 East to Paramus Road (exit under overpass). Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north for approximately two miles to college entrance on right.

## WHAT'S THE PROBLEM WITH MOTOR OIL?

Oil does not dissolve in water. When motor oil runs into storm drains either from changing your car's oil or from leaky cars, it goes directly to our lakes, rivers and the ocean. Oil and other petroleum products are toxic and can contaminate your drinking water, as well as kill fish, wildlife and plants. Did you know that one pint of oil can make a slick larger than a football field? Used motor oil is the largest single source of all oil pollution in lakes, streams and rivers. Americans spill 180 million gallons of used oil each year into our waters.

#### YOU CAN HELP!

- Keep your car well maintained.
- Regularly check your car for leaks and schedule tune-ups. If you find leaks or drips, have your car repaired.
- Take your car to a service center to the change oil.
- If you do change your own oil, do it in a garage, never on the street. Use a self-contained oil pan and discard the oil at a local service center for recycling.
- NEVER discard oil, gas, or antifreeze into a storm drain.
- If you spill hazardous fluids, contain it immediately with rags and cat litter. Clean up the spill and properly dispose of the waste.

#### WHY SHOULD YOU CARE ABOUT CLEAN WATER?

Stormwater pollution is one of the greatest threats to New Jersey's clean water supply. Clean water provides access to safe drinking water, a place for recreation, commercial opportunities, healthy wildlife habitats, and adds beauty to our landscape. Rain washes pollution from streets, parking lots, and lawns into storm drains, then directly into streams, rivers, lakes and the ocean.

Did you know more than 60 percent of water pollution comes from things like motor oil, fertilizers, pet waste, and detergents? By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater.

## 220/230 West Crescent Update

**<u>230 West Crescent</u>** was sold last year to Hampshire and they are currently renting out the space. This allowed Allendale to pay down a good portion of the debt.

**220 West Crescent** is much more complex and things have been slow. Hampshire reached out to several builders to bid on the both the residential and municipal building. The bidding process was arduous and complicated as we wanted it broken down line by line and as detailed as possible. The process took upwards of 6 months. The bids came back over budget due to Covid, inflation and the supply chain issue. The next step is to present this finding to the council sometime in February and discuss our options. We need to evaluate all scenarios from a cost perspective, legal perspective, needs/value perspective which takes a significant amount of research. If you wish to request a streetlight repair or request a new light, please call O&R at 1-877-434-4100 or fill out the form on-line by <u>CLICKING HERE</u>

To help us guarantee timely repair, please provide detailed information. The best detail you can give us? The 10-digit number on the yellow metal tags on the utility pole. Can't do that? Tell us the names of cross streets and intersections. Or give the location of a pole in relation to a house number or landmark.

## WARTER IS HERE CET YOUR SNOW SHOVELS OUT AND READY

The town code requires that sidewalks be maintained by the property owner abutting the sidewalk. Snow and ice must be removed within 24 hours so your neighbors and fellow residents can safely use the sidewalks.





We have received numerous complaints about the intersection of Myrtle Avenue and W. Crescent Ave. specifically in the morning, during school drop off hours.

As a friendly reminder to all motorists, New Jersey state law requires motorists to stop for both amber and for red signals. Intersections may only

be entered once the signal turns amber if a vehicle is so close as to not be able to stop safely, which by statute is within 50 feet. Regardless of traffic volume or speed no person should enter an intersection against the red signal. For detailed law on amber and red lights use an internet search engine and enter, "New Jersey statute 39:4–105." Fine is \$86 with two license points.
