ALLENDALE AMBULANCE CORPS CELEBRATING 85 YEARS of SERVICE!

The shrill tones of the pager go off. We stop what we are doing and wonder if this call will be a broken bone, a stroke, a heart attack, a motor vehicle crash or something else. The dispatcher informs us of the medical emergency and where we are headed. We are volunteers. We respond at the sound of those tones because we want to be a part of the solution. Because we care about our neighbors. We arrive at the scene. We never know what we will encounter, but we are ready. It is moments like this that you realize those long nights of training and even longer weekends of sitting in continuing education classes were the best use of your time. Without a second thought, we grab the O2 bottles, the stretcher, and the medical jump bag. We are trained for this--and knowing that the outcome may not be what we want, we are also confident that we will and are equipped to do everything humanly possible for our patients.

An hour or two later—or more: We have treated our patient and if needed, transported them to a nearby hospital. Our equipment has been cleaned and packed back into the rigs. We are ready for the next emergency. No one said this job is easy-and sometimes it is extremely sad-- but every one of us will tell you we are thankful we have the skills needed to help our town and our neighbors when tragedy strikes. AVAC can only do this with your generous support---whether it be through your time, financial gifts or emotional support. Thank you.

CLICK HERE FOR THE 2022 ALLENDALE GARBAGE AND **RECYCLING GUIDE**

- All items should be put out *starting at 6pm the night before* the scheduled collection.
- Building materials and wood pallets are not collected by our garbage contractor. You must make your own arrangements to dispose of them.
- You must schedule a one-time, courtesy move-out pickup with info@AllendaleNJ.gov at least 3 • WEEKS in advance. No metal, electronics, or recyclable materials collected.
- Remember to make sure that the lids are securely on top of your cans, especially garbage. This will help keep wildlife at bay.
- Collection containers can be no larger than 30 gallons.
- Bulk Trash must be placed on the curb and **not placed** in the road.
- Food containers being recycled need to be rinsed and cleaned before you dispose.
- Soiled pizza boxes are garbage and NOT recyclable.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE: COVID-19 RATEPAYER RELIEF MEASURES

This notice announces relief measures for residential ratepayers experiencing economic hardship during the COVID-19 pandemic. Please review this message in its entirety. INSTALLMENT PLAN AVAILABILITY

BE ADVISED that State law requires residential customers to be offered an installment plan for any water arrearages accruing between March 9, 2020 and March 15, 2022. To maintain the installment plan, a residential customer must make timely payments on all current charges. More information is available by calling SUEZ/ Allendale customer service at 855-367-6708.

LATE FEES, CHARGES AND PENALTIES

BE ADVISED that P.L. 2021, c. 317 prohibits local governments from charging residential customers interest, fees, or charges for late payment of water charges accruing between March 9, 2020 and March 15, 2022 until after March 15, 2022 at which time interest and penalties may begin to accrue. Late interest, fees or charges may be enforced against arrearages accruing before March 9, 2020 and after March 15, 2022.

BILL ASSISTANCE AND ARREARAGE FORGIVENESS PROGRAMS

The application period for the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs' Low Income Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is now open. This federally funded program will provide financial assistance to low-income households to reduce the balances on their residential water bills. LIHWAP will provide benefits directly to water service providers on behalf of residential customers. The assistance can be used, in order of priority, to:

- restore services where services have been terminated and pay reconnection fees and other charges accrued due to a disconnection;
- avoid service disruption for those residential customers who are in danger of disconnection (i.e., received shut off notices or have past due balances) and to help them afford bill payment going forward; and
- support those household customers who are current in their bills but might be in danger of falling behind in the near future.

Priority will also be given to families with elderly or disabled household members and/or with children under the age of five, no matter which category they fall into.

To be eligible for LIHWAP assistance, applicants must be water bill holders who are responsible for paying their water bills directly to the water provider. Also, applicants' total gross household income must be at or below 60% of the state median Income (\$6,439 a month for a family of four). The LIHWAP frequently asked questions webpage, available at https://njdca-housing.dynamics365portals.us/lihwapfaq has additional information about maximum income limits and other items.

Participants in the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) are automatically eligible for LIHWAP assistance so long as they are water bill holders.

People can apply online through the DCAid application portal at <u>https://njdca-housing.dynamics365portals.us/</u><u>en-US/dcaid-services/</u>.

Those without computer or internet access can call 1-800-510-3102 to be directed to one of the community action agencies to assist them with starting, completing, and submitting an application online.
