As Mayor, he represented our community as Chairman of the Northwest Bergen Mayors Association, Bergen County Mayors Association, the New Jersey Conference of Mayors, and the Legislative Committee of the New Jersey League of Municipalities. In recognition of his service, he was inducted into the Elected Officials Hall of Fame for his twenty years

MARK YOUR CALENDARS! Twice a week pick up starts the week of May 23rd! <u>CLICK</u> HERE for the 2022 Allendale Garbage and Recycling Guide for the full schedule.

- All items should be put out *starting at 6pm the night before* the scheduled collection. •
- Building materials and wood pallets are not collected by our garbage contractor. You must make • your own arrangements to dispose of them.
- You must schedule a one-time, courtesy move-out pickup with <u>TatianaMarquis@AllendaleNJ.gov</u> • at least 3 WEEKS in advance. No metal, electronics, or recyclable materials collected.
- Remember to make sure that the lids are securely on top of your cans, especially garbage. This will help keep wildlife at bay.
- Collection containers can be no larger than 30 gallons.
- Bulk Trash must be placed on the curb and **not placed** in the road.
- Food containers being recycled need • to be rinsed and cleaned before you dispose.
- Soiled pizza boxes are garbage and NOT recyclable.

Emergency Road Closures



The Allendale Police would like to relay information about navigating (no pun intended) when a road is closed for emergency reasons. Unplanned road closures can be stressful and frustrating for the motorist. Unfortunately, there are circumstances beyond our control which would necessitate closing a roadway. Many times, an emergency

such as a wire down or motor vehicle crash will cause a dangerous condition for vehicles traveling on the roadway. Whenever possible, roadways are closed at intersections which permit a detour around the emergency. Typically, an emergency vehicle is parked perpendicular to the roadway or cones/barricades are in the middle of the roadway. These both indicate an immediate hazard which is danger to life and/or property. Do not go around these closures unless escorted by emergency personnel. Disregarding these road closed indicators could put your life at risk. At times, local residents can be permitted to travel to their homes which are in between the closure and the hazard. This can only be granted by emergency personnel on scene and must be with great caution. If a barricade is moved, the law says it must be restored by the person moving it. Whenever possible, the police department will announce planned road closures through Constant Contact and/or Swiftreach. For thru traffic, please pull safely off the roadway, bring your vehicle to a stop, and utilize mapping programs such as Maps or Waze to find an alternate route.

Message from the Allendale Water Committee

The water committee has been alerted to social media misinformation on increasing water bills this year. There has not been an Allendale water rate increase since January 2021. If a resident is noticing an increase in their water bill, they should investigate their property for potential water leaks. Suez (now VEOLIA) has not yet completed its purchase of the Allendale water system. The anticipated closing is late summer/early fall 2022. The Board of Public Utilities needs to approve the transaction and the proposed 10-year rate schedule. The rate schedule that has been proposed is as follows.

Allendale water currently remains in compliance with all NJDEP Quality regulations. SUEZ is fully committed to meeting and exceeding requirements for the removal of PFAS from our drinking water as the EPA and NJDEP introduce new regulations. Levels of PFAS at the existing New Street Wells are near the regulatory limits, Well 11 is currently turned off. The parties have concluded that treatment will be needed prior to completion of the Permanent New Street Treatment Plant and as such the parties have agreed that should the sale of the water system to Suez proceed as planned, Suez shall design, construct, and install temporary PFAS treatment at the New Street Treatment Plant on or before May 2023. If Allendale water exceeds the maximum contaminant limits prior to this time, residents will be notified.

This notice announces relief measures for residential ratepayers experiencing economic hardship during the COVID-19 pandemic. Please review this message in its entirety. INSTALLMENT PLAN AVAILABILITY

BE ADVISED that State law requires residential customers to be offered an installment plan for any water arrearages accruing between March 9, 2020 and March 15, 2022. To maintain the installment plan, a residential customer must make timely payments on all current charges. More information is available by calling SUEZ/ Allendale customer service at 855-367-6708.

LATE FEES, CHARGES AND PENALTIES

BE ADVISED that P.L. 2021, c. 317 prohibits local governments from charging residential customers interest, fees, or charges for late payment of water charges accruing between March 9, 2020 and March 15, 2022 until after March 15, 2022 at which time interest and penalties may begin to accrue. Late interest, fees or charges may be enforced against arrearages accruing before March 9, 2020 and after March 15, 2022.

BILL ASSISTANCE AND ARREARAGE FORGIVENESS PROGRAMS

The application period for the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs' Low Income Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is now open. This federally funded program will provide financial assistance to low-income households to reduce the balances on their residential water bills. LIHWAP will provide benefits directly to water service providers on behalf of residential customers. The assistance can be used, in order of priority, to:

- restore services where services have been terminated and pay reconnection fees and other charges accrued due to a disconnection;
- avoid service disruption for those residential customers who are in danger of disconnection (i.e., received shut off notices or have past due balances) and to help them afford bill payment going forward; and
- support those household customers who are current in their bills but might be in danger of falling behind in the near future.

Priority will also be given to families with elderly or disabled household members and/or with children under the age of five, no matter which category they fall into.

To be eligible for LIHWAP assistance, applicants must be water bill holders who are responsible for paying their water bills directly to the water provider. Also, applicants' total gross household income must be at or below 60% of the state median Income (\$6,439 a month for a family of four). The LIHWAP frequently asked questions webpage, available at https://njdca-housing.dynamics365portals.us/lihwapfaq has additional information about maximum income limits and other items.

Participants in the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) are automatically eligible for LIHWAP assistance so long as they are water bill holders.
