Both the Water Committee and the Mayor & Council are pleased that the overwhelming majority of Allendale voters agreed with our confidence that SUEZ will be the best steward of our water system in the future. Today's challenges with PFAS contamination and emerging contaminants, along with future regulations, will be managed by a company whose main focus and expertise is water. This is a benefit to all Allendale residents.

There were many reasons for our support of this sale, the main ones being:

- SUEZ's TECHNICAL KNOWLEDGE SUEZ has a full team of experts with the
  experience to manage and improve the system today and, more importantly,
  SUEZ has the expertise to understand and plan for tomorrow's emerging
  contaminants and regulations.
- 2. SUEZ's COMMITMENT TO INFRASTRUCTURE SUEZ has committed to tens of millions of dollars worth of improvements, the most essential of which is the building of a PFAS treatment plant, estimated to cost \$7 million, which SUEZ will manage integrating into our present distribution system. SUEZ has also committed to many other upgrades to make our aging system run more efficiently.
- 3. THE POSITIVE ECONOMICS The proposed rate plan from SUEZ has substantially lower rate increases than Allendale would require over the next 5 years for the same investment. The \$18 million cash offer is financially beneficial to all Allendale residents and, by statute, will be used to pay off all current municipal debt. The additional monies will be budgeted through the standard budgeting process.

The Purchase Agreement executing the sale still requires approval by the Board of Public Utilities (BPU). We are hopeful for the closing of the sale to occur in May/June 2022, at which time SUEZ will take ownership of the system. Until that time, Allendale and SUEZ will continue to work together implementing temporary PFAS treatment at our New Street facility and our currently closed West Crescent well.

# CLICK HERE **FOR THE 2021** LLENDALE GARBAGE AND RECYCLING JUIDE

- All items should be put out *starting at 6pm the night before* the scheduled collection.
- Wood pallets are not collected by our garbage contractor. You must make your own arrangements to dispose of them.
- You must schedule a one-time, courtesy move-out pickup with <u>TatianaMarquis@AllendaleNJ.gov</u> at least 3 WEEKS in advance. No metal, electronics, or recyclable materials collected.

Remember to make sure that the lids are securely on top of your cans, especially garbage. This will

help keep wildlife at bay.

- Collection containers can be no larger than 30 gallons.
- Bulk Trash must be placed on the curb and **not placed** in the road.
- Food containers being recycled need to be rinsed and cleaned before you dispose.
- Soiled pizza boxes are garbage and NOT recyclable.

- Green, clear and brown glass bottles and jars





### HEALTHY LAWNS = HEALTHY WATER

#### WHAT YOU CAN DO:

- **1. Choose a no phosphorus and slow-release nitrogen fertilizer.** Check the first and second number on the package for nitrogen and phosphate content. Formula, 26-0-3, for example, means no phosphate.
- 2. Apply fertilizer at the spreader setting shown on the bag, to avoid overuse or underuse of product.
- 3. Return any unused product to the original container for future use.
- 4. Do not apply fertilizer products if a heavy rain is predicted.
- 5. Use a drop spreader or a rotary spreader with a side guard to keep fertilizer on the lawn and off driveways, roadways and walkways. Sweep up excess fertilizer from paved surfaces.
- 6. For a healthier, greener lawn, fertilize after the first lawn cutting in the spring and again in the fall when weather conditions are best for grass to absorb nutrients.
- **7. Soil tests can help identify what nutrients your lawn needs.** Contact your County Extension Agent at http://njaes.rutgers.edu/county/ for details and other helpful lawn and garden information.

As the cold weather is upon us, the Allendale Office of Emergency Management would like to convey the following safety tips:

#### When you are outside, frostbite and hypothermia are possible so you need to protect yourself.

- 1. Wear layers of loose-fitting, lightweight, warm clothing.
- 2. Wear a hat. Try to stay dry and out of the wind.
- 3. Cover your mouth to protect your lungs from extreme cold.
- 4. Mittens, snug at the wrist, are better than gloves.

#### To keep pipes from freezing on an outside wall:

- 1. Let hot and cold water trickle or drip at night from a faucet.
- 2. Open cabinet doors to allow more heat to get to un-insulated pipes under a sink or near an outer wall.
- 3. Make sure heat is left on and set no lower than 55 degrees.
- 4. If you plan to be away: (1) Have someone check your house daily to make sure the heat is still on to prevent freezing, or (2) drain and shut off the water system (except indoor sprinkler systems).


#### If Pipes Freeze:

- 1. Make sure you and your family knows how to shut off the water, in case pipes burst.
- 2. **NEVER** try to thaw a pipe with an open flame or torch. Use a hair dryer instead.

#### Carbon monoxide poisoning is a silent, deadly killer claiming about 1,000 lives each year in the United States.

- Install a carbon monoxide detector.
- 2. **NEVER** run generators indoors.

#### Who is eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine in New Jersey?

# Everyone 5 years or older is eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine in New Jersey and encouraged to get vaccinated as soon as possible.

- All adults (18 and older) are eligible for the two-dose Pfizer, two-dose Moderna or one-dose Johnson & Johnson vaccines.
- All adolescents ages 12 through 17 are eligible for the two-dose Pfizer vaccine.
- All children ages 5 through 11 are eligible for the pediatric two-dose Pfizer vaccine.
- People who are moderately to severely immune compromised are eligible for a third dose of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines.
- All adults (18 and older) who received a single dose of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine are eligible for a booster dose, at least two months after their shot.
- Adults 65 and older, long-term care residents, adults with underlying medical conditions, and adults who work or
  live in high-risk settings who received the two-dose Pfizer or Moderna vaccine are eligible for a booster shot at least
  six months after their second shot.
