

ALLENDALE HISTORY FRED LITT BOROUGH HISTORIAN MAUDE CONNELLY AND THE ABEG



In 2023, the Allendale Bar and Grill (the AB&G, the "G") will celebrate the 76th anniversary of its founding by Maude A. Connelly. On October 11, 1947, Ms. Connelly, forever known by the beloved nickname "Mom", opened the doors to her new restaurant/tavern, the Allendale Bar & Grill.

The AB&G was born from a determined businesswoman, a widow, a mother of five daughters, who won a contest over a liquor license In 1945, tavern manager Maude Connelly stands in between herself and Allendale Hotel owner, Ethel Braun Maratene.

Beginning in the early 1900s, the Braun family owned and managed Kunisch, and grandson Michael. the Allendale Hotel. The hotel tavern was popular and well known to train travelers and nearby farmers. The Great Depression and the passing of owner Valentine J. Braun began the decline of the hotel, eventually leading to the surrender of the liquor license by the Braun family.

In 1935, Maude and husband Michael Connelly moved to Allendale to manage the Allendale Hotel. Michael had the business acumen to apply for and receive the liquor license surrendered by the Braun family. After Michael's passing in 1938, Maude kept working, creating a business that would continue to thrive, managed today by her great-grandchildren, Chris, Craig, and Katie.

Maude's journey to establish the AB&G had some tense moments. In 1947, she purchased 67 West Allendale Avenue to begin her own tavern, investing \$26,000 to construct the bar and

grill addition. In addition, her liquor license needed to be transferred from her use at the Allendale Hotel to her new business. A legal battle ensued, as Maude wanted to have the liquor license transferred to her

new tavern, while Allendale Hotel owner Ethel Braun Maratene wanted to keep it for her new hotel tavern venture.

On September 11, 1947, after a public hearing at the firehouse, the council voted five to one for Maude Connelly to have the license transferred to her new tavern, soon to be known as the Allendale Bar and Grill. Cheering followed the decision. The beginning of the AB&G was also the end of the Allendale Hotel as a viable restaurant and tavern.

Why did your property taxes increase if the tax rate continues to decrease?

Property tax is a tax based on the value of the property. Therefore, the market value of a property is the standard that is used to determine one's taxes.

Property taxes are calculated by multiplying your total assessment by the tax rate.

For example: If your 2023 assessment is \$500,000, you would use the following calculation: $$500,000 \times 2.199\% = $10,995.00$

The 1st and 2nd quarter bills are preliminary bills which are calculated using the prior years' tax rate. The 3rd and 4th quarter will be billed using the new tax rate for that year. An estimated tax rate is generally used for the 3rd quarter billing when the final tax rate has not struck by the County by the deadline to send out tax bills.

NEW JERSEY RESIDENTS

ANCHOR Benefit Confirmation Letters have been mailed notifying taxpayers of their eligibility.

ANCHOR Property Tax Relief The NJ Div. of Taxation will file 2020 ANCHOR applications on behalf of most qualified residents who received a 2019 ANCHOR benefit earlier this year. If you qualify, you would have received an "ANCHOR Benefit Confirmation Letter" in August of 2023, notifying you that you met the requirements.

Senior Freeze Property Tax Reimbursement



• You were age 65 or older on December 31, 2021, or you were receiving Social Security disability payments on December 31, 2021, and also on December 31, 2022;

and

• You lived in New Jersey continuously since December 31, 2011, or earlier as either a homeowner or renter;

and

• You owned and lived in your home or leased a site in a mobile home park for a manufactured or mobile home that you owned since December 31, 2018, or earlier;

and

• You paid all 2021 property taxes by June 1, 2022, and all 2022 property taxes by June 1, 2023;

and

- Your annual income was less than \$94,178* in 2021 and less than \$99,735* in 2022. With some exceptions, all income must be taken into account, including Social Security, pension, etc.
- * Eligibility rules, income limits, and benefits may be changed by the State Budget that will take effect on July 1, 2023.
